### From the Pastor's Desk....

We all are familiar with the scene from today's Gospel. It depicts Jesus calling His disciples, choosing the individuals He wanted to be "fishers of men." Let's not overlook what is described here. Jesus is calling, choosing and selecting those persons He wishes to change and give new meaning to their lives. They are to leave their old professions and selves behind and to win over people for the Gospel and the ministry of Jesus.

Such a linking of teacher and students (rabbi and disciples) usually occurred in reverse order. It was the followers of any teacher (or rabbi) who selected the individual they wished to follow. Such a teacher was chosen because his approach to God and philosophy of life appealed to the individual. It is similar to how we choose political candidates, or people we admire or cars or products at the store. The individuals themselves make a choice for what appeals to them personally.

In the Gospel, it is Jesus Christ who calls and selects. The response of the individual follower is not to see in Jesus Christ what is appealing, attractive, or popular. Each person who answers the call is required to change. In the Gospel the disciples no longer catch fish, but seek out men and women, individual souls for Jesus Christ to embrace the Gospel message of salvation and forgiveness. St. Paul reminds us as well, today, that we do not embrace a particular priest, or preacher, or "cult figure," who appeals to our personal style and taste. It is the Gospel message and Jesus Christ, who must be embraced.
