From the Pastor's Desk...

The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is not only the cornerstone of all Christian belief, but it is also the most significant event of all human history. Jesus Christ, God become man, permitted Himself to be handed over to sinful humanity. He suffered injustice, betrayal, and execution on the cross. The power of God has been displayed over sin and even death. He chose willingly to share our death and fear of death. But now – Jesus Christ, who was dead – has been raised.

The first disciples were initially unbelieving. An empty tomb does not prove that anyone has risen from the dead. Their belief in the Resurrection of the Lord was established by their own eyewitness to the risen Jesus. Only then did they begin to understand fully all that Jesus had taught them. Their belief became Resurrection faith as they understood that they need fear nothing. They went out and began to preach and live the Gospel message Jesus had proclaimed. They were transformed to their very core and they no longer feared or hid themselves away.

We are called to be people of the Resurrection. We are called to live the Easter faith. We must give witness to the belief in the power of God who is able to overcome all evil, even death. Transformed by the experience of Lent and our belief in Resurrection, let us courageously give witness to the power of the Resurrection.
