From the Pastor's Desk....

Where is the risen Jesus Christ? Where is Christ in our own personal lives when we need the assurance of His presence? Where is the presence of Christ in today's world, which could sorely use a divine healer, comforter, and mediator? This question is posed by faithful, believing people today, who could truly use a source of strength and reassurance. The theme of Jesus' apparent absence appears twice in today's Gospel when both Mary and Martha needed Jesus. Their brother, Lazarus, was sick and eventually died. The critics of Jesus in the Gospel are also quick with a remark: "Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?"

Faith in the risen Christ challenges us to realize that even though Jesus did not rush to Martha and Mary's side, Jesus calls Lazarus from the tomb, even though the stench of death permeates the opened tomb. This is the faith we are called to have in the Church today. We fear death, naturally, because we fear what we do not know and cannot control. It is, however, the faith of the Christian to believe - even in a world filled and colored by death in so many ways - that the dead are "asleep" as was Lazarus. We wait for the Resurrection, the ultimate event of our lives, when we too - like Christ - will be transformed in glory.

Holy Week at Holy Spirit and St. Philip is the most sacred week in the Christian calendar, and Catholics, in particular, hold the three days of the Sacred Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday) as special days of prayer and liturgical observance. Please consider attending the special services of these three days as an important way to celebrate the most important event of our salvation: the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Wednesday of Holy Week, April 16, at 7:00 p.m. Parish Mass in preparation of the Triduum (no Soup Supper tonight).

Holy Thursday, April 17, all parishioners from Holy Spirit and St. Philip Parishes are invited to share a meal together at 6:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall and celebrate the Mass of the Last Supper in the church at 7:30 p.m.

Good Friday, April 18, at 2:00 p.m. at St. Philip and 7:00 p.m. at Holy Spirit is the solemn Celebration of the Death of Our Lord Jesus Christ. The Passion according to John is proclaimed, the holy cross is venerated, and Holy Communion is distributed. There is no Mass on Good Friday.

Holy Saturday, April 19, at 8:30 p.m. at St. Philip Church, we will celebrate the Easter Vigil, preceded by the beautiful, once-a-year ceremonies of the Easter Night: The blessing of the New Fire, the lighting of the Easter Candle, Scripture readings narrating Salvation History, admission of the Candidates into full communion in the Church.
