From the Pastor's Desk....

It is really a sobering thought for all of us that one's life does not consist of possessions. So much of our hard work and effort consists of acquiring things. Yet, today's Gospel is an urgent, cautionary tale for all of us, warning us that the life we seek as disciples is not the life of material goods, but rather the life which finds its fulfillment in God.

The rich man of today's Gospel is content to rest on his laurels and the overabundant produce of his harvest. It does not occur to him to share the excess of his labors with those in need. He instead decides to build larger storage barns, perhaps in the belief that he truly needs so much more than he and his household can reasonably consume. The rich man is rich, but not as it turns out, rich in what truly matters.

Notice that in this Gospel, when Jesus says, "Take care to guard against all greed," He does not draw the boundary line for us, a line that divides reasonable concerns for one's own well-being and genuine greed. That determination is left for us. But this parable is clear on one point: God demands more of a disciple than self-centered greed. A disciple's life should be focused on God; it should not be attached to worldly goods.

What we are currently hearing from Pope Francis is for so many reasons not only instructive, but also refreshing. He is reminding believers everywhere that the gulf between the well off and the extremely poor, in our country and around the world, continues to grow unabated. Pope Francis does not preach class envy or class warfare, but he reminds us that the best way to lose one's self and find God lies in letting go of our desire to have, hold and acquire more. If we truly believe that we can't take it with us, we cannot allow our life decision to be the building of bigger barns.
