

From the Pastor's Desk...


The Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ is the very heart of the life of the Church as well as the focal point of this weekend's liturgy. As Catholics, we believe that under the physical form and appearance of bread and wine, Jesus Christ is truly present, both physically and spiritually, under these Sacramental signs. When we come together to celebrate the Eucharist, we proclaim the death and resurrection of the Lord. The self-sacrifice of Christ on the cross becomes the model for all Christian love and morality. His Resurrection calls us to live as people of Easter faith, confident that if we die with Christ, we shall also rise with Him.

On this feast of "Corpus Christi," the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, a few reminders are always helpful for us, not only do they deepen our belief, but also perhaps they can make us more aware of what we do when we receive the Body and Blood of the Lord.

- The Eucharist unites us with the Lord Jesus as well as with all others as members of the Body of Christ. As we grow in our love of Jesus Christ, we become more like Him. As we grow in our love, we realize our need to demonstrate perfect love and forgiveness with all who are united with us. This is truly a powerful, spiritual connection, hence the term "Communion" - union with Christ and with one another.
- As we grow in our awareness of what we do, we more readily can demonstrate our reverence for this Sacrament. Receiving communion worthily is important at all times, as well as proper focus and attention to the reception of Holy Communion. Receiving communion is not the time "to see or be seen" by others. It is our great moment to really focus on this great gift given by Jesus to us at the Last Supper.
- When we understand the importance of the Eucharist, we then understand the importance of Mass. How can we grow and deepen our faith, what better way is there to strengthen our commitment to living true, Christian love than by coming to Mass on Sunday, hearing the Word (of Scripture) and in the Sacrament of His Body and Blood to help us face the challenges of life!

Deacon Thomas Gardner's St. Philip Connection. On Friday, May 2, 2014, Bishop Francis Campbell ordained five transitional deacons for the Diocese of Columbus. A "transitional" deacon has intentions of seeking ordination to the Priesthood, as opposed to a permanent deacon, such as the late Joe Farry and our present deacon, George Zimmermann.

Among these five men was Deacon Thomas Gardner of St. Catherine Parish. He is the grandson of Patricia Gardner of St. Philip Parish and the late Howard Gardner, who died this past March. Please pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life, in particular for these five newly ordained deacons from our Diocese of Columbus. Their ordination date to the priesthood is scheduled for May 23, 2015.

St. Philip Food Pantry. As you may have noticed in the bulletin the last several weeks, demand for help for the Food Pantry is high, and climbing, during these last couple of months. Support from neighboring parishes (Elizabeth Ann Seton, St. Mary Groveport, St. Matthew, Holy Spirit, St. Timothy) remains strong. Needless to say, these other parishes are an important component of our pantry support net. This important ministry here at St. Philip will need your continuing support in the last six months of 2014. The St. Vincent de Paul members will once again stand at the doors of the Church after Mass, **on the second Sunday of every month**, beginning the weekend of July 12 and 13. Your extra \$5.00 or \$10.00 a month makes a huge difference in the finances of the pantry.

The envelopes in your monthly packet will continue to appear quarterly. This will enable check/cash donations through the collection basket to continue, and those who are homebound will also be able to send in their donations. May God bless all of you who keep our pantry open and thriving, and a sign of hope in our neighborhood.

How to Receive Holy Communion - This Sunday is the feast of the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, or Corpus Christi. This would be an excellent opportunity to review the procedures on receiving Holy Communion at Mass. The following represents excerpts taken from our Diocesan newspaper, The Catholic Times, in the "Question and Answer" column by Fr. Kenneth Doyle of the Catholic News Service.

The guidelines for the reception of Holy Communion are expressed most clearly in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal.

1. The host may be received either on the tongue or the hand, and the choice belongs to the communicant.
2. Should the host be received on the tongue, the communicant should slightly tilt the head back, open the mouth and extend the tongue out, allowing the priest to place the host on the tongue. (In no case should the communicant attempt to take the host from the priest's finger with the lips in order to secure the host.)
3. If Communion is taken on the hand, the following procedure is used. If the person is right handed, he or she should open the left hand fully and place it over the right hand, creating as the theologian Tertullian said, a "throne for the Lord."
4. Each nation's Conference of Bishops has the right to decide the posture to be used in receiving Communion, as well as the particular gesture of reverence before receiving.

The priest places the host in the left palm and then, using the fingers of the right hand, the communicant puts the host into his or her mouth (Never should a communicant reach out to the priest and grab the host.)

The U.S. Bishops have determined that Communion is to be received while standing, following a simple bow of the head (such as one uses when pronouncing the name of Jesus.)

The fact that a communicant is receiving the body of Christ is paramount and overrides any consideration of posture or gesture. But a certain uniformity creates an orderly and more reverent flow. It also highlights the fact that the reception of Communion is not just an individual act of faith and piety, but illustrates the unity and spirituality of Christ's followers.

5. Remember, always: When the priest (or Eucharistic minister) pronounces the words: "The Body of Christ," please respond with a firm, audible, "Amen"! This is a personal act of faith. **Never** respond with "Thank You, Father," or any other variation of this response.
