From the Pastor's Desk...

This Sunday's Gospel presents us with a parable that can be difficult to understand. After all, why should anyone be punished for returning property intact and unharmed? Is it really fair to take from the one who has little and give it to the person who has more? Why would anyone expect to harvest crops from a field he did not plant seed in? It all seems rather confusing.



Try instead to understand today's parable in a different way. A "talent" is a great source of money, but try to understand these talents as something else besides just money. In telling this parable, Jesus is giving His disciples a lesson about judgement at the end of time. All these servants in today's Gospel have been given something and are expected to do something - to do something more - with it, in the master's absence. When he returns, he expects to see that these servants have accomplished great things upon his arrival.

The parables of the last three weeks have all been about the return of the king, the master, and the bridegroom. Upon their return, they expect to see that everyone has been doing their jobs and fulfilling their obligations. Jesus is teaching His disciples that the Word, the Good News, the Kingdom, are all being entrusted to them. When He returns for judgement, He hopes that He will find all disciples fast at work, multiplying the works of forgiveness, healing and mercy.

Consider what Paul was writing to the Thessalonians in today's second reading. They were all arguing about when "the day of the Lord" would come. He reminded his readers that they knew neither the day nor hour. As children of the light and the day, he tells them not to sleep - or to sit around and wait for "the day of the Lord." They must always remain awake, alert, and sober, realizing that when the day of the Lord comes, He will find us hard at work.

Having a Child Baptized? Here at Holy Spirit, we have some helpful guidelines in preparing a family to have their child baptized.

- All parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class. The class is offered on the Second Wednesday of every month at 7:00 p.m. in the parish office. Preregistration for this class is requested at least one week prior to the class.
- **In order to register for the Baptism Preparation Class, the parents must be registered parishioners of Holy Spirit for at least 6 months.** If you are not currently registered, we can assist you and register you for an upcoming class.

- Generally, Baptisms take place after 11:00 a.m. Mass on the first and last Sundays of the month. Please note that other children may be baptized on the same day as your child. We do not baptize during the season of Lent. We also do not schedule Baptisms on Sundays that take place near Holy Days or major holidays.
- The Sacrament may be celebrated in English or Spanish. Please understand that a Baptism may be scheduled in another language on the Sunday you desire. Your child's Baptism may need to be scheduled on another Sunday.
