## From the Pastor's Desk...

Why do people often follow the call of a stranger? Perhaps a stranger's voice seems unique and different, and therefore attractive and maybe trustworthy. I can think of, for example, telemarketers (on the phone), solicitors (at the front door), slick advertisers (on television). These individuals often make outlandish claims which lure people in. These claims often prove false, if not downright deceptive.

Leaders of religious or social cults also come to mind. There have been great leaders in history and world events who have led whole nations down the road of destruction, mesmerizing their blind followers in the process. I guess the famous circus leader was right: "a sucker is born every minute." The unfamiliar and untested voices in the world prove the old saying: You can fool part of the people part of the time.

Jesus, as the Good Shepherd, speaks in today's Gospel about the familiarity of the sheep with **their** shepherd's voice. The shepherd's voice is familiar to them. There is trust, comfort, and safety in his manner and tone. This attraction only to their shepherd's voice is a remarkable trait of these docile and somewhat defenseless animals. The bond between a good shepherd and his sheep is intimate, close, and enduring.

This is the relationship we are invited to have with God. This is the relationship that Jesus desired with His disciples. Jesus Christ wants only for us what is in our best interests for our eternal salvation. Jesus did not want His followers lured away by thieves and robbers, people who care nothing for us. It is similar to parents, who watch sons and daughters stray from family and those who truly love them. Where the road of life is rough, where the going gets tough, when we feel discouraged and lost, we should follow, in faith, the voice of the Shepherd.
