

From the Pastor's Desk...

On the Second Sunday of Easter (April 27), Thomas the Apostle was center stage in the Gospel. He withheld belief in the risen Jesus until he himself had experienced the physical presence of the risen Lord. Thomas is back today, asking Jesus in an almost childlike way how they (the disciples) could find their way and follow Jesus, if they weren't sure about who He was and where He was going.

Jesus admonishes His listeners again, reminding them that faith overcomes uncertainty and their fear of abandonment. The familiar phrase "do not let your hearts be troubled" is intended to assure the close circle around Jesus that trust and confidence in **Him** is the essential element of discipleship. Jesus does not just point out the way, or speak truth, or give life. It is Jesus Himself who is the way, truth and life. This is Jesus' divine identity.

But it is Philip who presses Jesus further. He wishes to see the Father, and then, he says "that will be enough for us." He seeks proof that Jesus is who He says He is. Jesus' response, somewhat disappointed, is nonetheless gentle. He patiently teaches Philip and the inner circle one more time: if you see me, you have seen the Father. Jesus knew that faith takes time to grow. Let's remember, we are no different from Thomas or Philip. Oftentimes, in uncertainty and disbelief, we seek to know God. Sometimes people turn away from God and lose their way. It is in the identity of Jesus that we find our source of life, our way and the truth.

More about St. Pope John XXIII. Anyone 60 years of age or older remembers the man known as "Good Pope John." Although few people had as great an impact on the 20th Century as did John XXIII, he avoided the limelight as much as possible. Indeed, one writer has noted that his "ordinariness" seems one of his most remarkable qualities.

He was the oldest of fourteen children, born of a farming family in 1881, in Sotto Il Monte, near Bergamo, in northern Italy. They were sharecroppers – farming the land not their own, and sharing the profits and products with the owner. His background was extremely simple, and shaped his personality and character, life-long.

He was ordained a priest in 1904. He experienced World War I (1914-1918) first hand as a chaplain and stretcher bearer. In 1925, he became a papal diplomat, serving in Bulgaria, Turkey, and finally in France (1944-1953). During World War II, he was credited with saving an estimated 24,000 Jews from the reach of the Nazis.

In 1953, he became the Cardinal Patriarch of Venice. After the death of Pope Pius XII, Cardinal Roncalli, in a surprise outcome at the conclave, was elected Pope on October 25, 1958. Shortly thereafter, he made known his decision to convoke an Ecumenical Council, Vatican II, which reshaped the face of Catholicism with a new liturgy and new approach to the world.

His legacy for the Church is enormous. His contacts and experience with leaders of non-Catholic faiths gave impetus to the movement for dialogue for Christian Unity. His teaching encyclical, *Pacem in Terris* ("Peace on Earth) placed the Church at the forefront of dialogue to ease the nuclear arms race and the Cold War between the United States and the Soviet Union.

The events of St. John XXIII's life and papacy seem like yesterday to this individual who experienced them. Upon his death, on June 3, 1963, not only the Catholic Church, but world leaders and members of religious faiths around the world mourned his passing. It has been observed that he led the Church into the modern world. Today, Catholicism still seeks dialogue beyond the walls of the Church itself with cultures and world views not in agreement with the Church's witness to the truth of the Gospel.
