From the Pastor's Desk....

How do we meet and recognize Jesus Christ in our time?

Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta instructed her fellow sisters that they could encounter Christ in the worn faces, in the tired hands and feet, in the broken bodies of the poor on the streets of Calcutta. This is a profound recognition of Christ in others, especially in the lives of the least unimportant of our brothers and sisters. Jesus, remember, commanded us to see Himself in the faces of the "unbeautiful" and "unimportant" of our world.

In today's Gospel, two of Jesus' disciples are leaving Jerusalem on the first Easter Sunday. They tell their disappointment and sadness to a stranger, who walks with them on the road to Emmaus. The stranger explains to them that their hopes in the "Christ" have not been in vain. The Christ had first to suffer and die, sharing our human experience, before He could be raised from the dead. Their anxiety and curiosity are at one moment relieved and satisfied when they recognize Jesus in the breaking of the bread at table. They had met the risen Christ, and had not realized it.

We, too, can meet and recognize the risen Lord in the Bread of the altar. We walk by faith and not by sight, as St. Paul writes. Jesus left us the Eucharist as the living sign of His presence for all time. This is our act of faith when we receive Jesus Christ in the sacrament of His Body and Blood. It is also faith that empowers us to see Jesus in the lives of the least important people all around us: in the sick and suffering, in the friend and stranger, and even in the faces of those who love and know us least.
