From the Pastor's Desk. . .

Consider the simple action that for Catholics is almost a reflex action. At the beginning and end of every Mass, before and after every prayer, Catholics make the sign of the cross and say "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Every time this brief formula is spoken, we acknowledge our belief in God and the cross, the symbol of our salvation. The sign of the cross is a simple yet powerful statement of faith, done sometimes with such automatic speed that it is easy to forget the importance of this formula to Catholic Christian faith.

It represents for us nothing less than how God has revealed the Divinity to us. It represents how we have experienced God. It represents also how we are the people of God, formed in the image of the Trinity. God is Father and Creator, source of all life and source of all blessing. God is the Son, Jesus Christ, who took on human form and demonstrated the depth of divine love on the cross. God is the Spirit, who inspires, sanctifies, and comforts all believers and is present with us until the end of time. These are powerful beliefs, and they are at the center of Catholic faith. This "prayer practice" of signing ourselves signifies not only to whom we belong, but also our intention of performing every action in God's name. This is a mystery of belief and needs to be experienced and practiced every day.

But how do people, in this age of unbelief, claim to have experienced God? Their statements about God are all over the place. Some view God as the source or cause of their misfortunes and difficulties. Some hold God to be a wise, yet confused Judge who punishes the good, overlooks the weak, and rewards the haves and haughty of this world. Others view belief in a divine Creator as the source of mankind's intolerance because so many hold differing views of the same God. Still others, when they view the power and effects of evil in the world, reject the whole notion of God completely.

God is love. He loved us so much that He became one of us. God's motives and intentions have been questioned and second guessed ever since. Just as people in Jesus' day rejected forgiveness for sinners, love for the poor and powerless, and self-sacrifice for the good of others, we still fight today these sins against God's love. The most important belief about God, however, is this: He still and always calls us, even if we reject Him.

St. Philip coffee and donuts will be on summer vacation and will resume in September. We wish all of you a very safe and happy summer. See you in the fall!

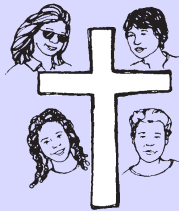

Our Shared Parish Events and Information



How to Receive Holy Communion - Next Sunday is the feast of the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, or Corpus Christi. This would be an excellent opportunity to review the procedures on receiving Holy Communion at Mass. The following represents excerpts taken from our Diocesan newspaper, The Catholic Times, in the "Question and Answer" column by Fr. Kenneth Doyle of the Catholic News Service.

The guidelines for the reception of Holy Communion are expressed most clearly in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal.

1. The host may be received either on the tongue or the hand, and the choice belongs to the communicant.
2. Should the host be received on the tongue, the communicant should slightly tilt the head back, open the mouth and extend the tongue out, allowing the priest to place the host on the tongue. (In no case should the communicant attempt to take the host from the priest's finger with the lips in order to secure the host.)
3. If Communion is taken on the hand, the following procedure is used. If the person is right handed, he or she should open the left hand fully and place it over the right hand, creating as the theologian Tertullian said, a "throne for the Lord."

The priest places the host in the left palm and then, using the fingers of the right hand, the communicant puts the host into his or her mouth. (Never should a communicant reach out to the priest and grab the host.)

4. Each nation's Conference of Bishops has the right to decide the posture to be used in receiving Communion, as well as the particular gesture of reverence before receiving.

The U.S. Bishops have determined that Communion is to be received while standing, following a simple bow of the head (such as one uses when pronouncing the name of Jesus).

The fact that a communicant is receiving the body of Christ is paramount and overrides any consideration of posture or gesture. But a certain uniformity creates an orderly and more reverent flow. It also highlights the fact that the reception of Communion is not just an individual act of faith and piety, but illustrates the unity and spirituality of Christ's followers.

5. Remember, always: When the priest (or Eucharistic minister) pronounces the words: "The Body of Christ," please respond with a firm, audible, "Amen!" This is a personal act of faith. **Never** respond with "Thank You, Father," or any other variation of this response.
