## From the Pastor's Desk...

Weeds are a problem for every gardener and farmer. They detract from the appeal and beauty of the garden, and they rob the good plants of water and nutrients. Farmers, on a far larger scale, may experience a decrease in the yield of their cash crop. Gardeners and farmers attempt to eliminate their weeds, by painstaking labor or by herbicides. It amounts to an added investment of time, labor, and cash. But, they consider it necessary.

Jesus was many things. He was, above all else, a realist. He was certainly not naïve. In proclaiming and describing (through parables) the Kingdom of God, Jesus knew that the world God created and humanity itself were both a mix of good and bad, existing side by side and sometimes difficult to distinguish. As a gardener or farmer can surely distinguish between the weeds and wheat, it is not quite that simple with the minds and intentions of people. In real life and in the real world, evil masquerades as the good. Even people we might consider evil or reprehensible may not be so, because our own judgment is blurred.

Jesus knew that only God can separate the good and the bad and some in one group will one day be revealed as belonging to the other. This situation, however, is precisely the "mystery" of the Kingdom of God. Jesus knew that as much as faithful disciples build and cultivate the Kingdom in this world, evil is seemingly everywhere in this world. And just how can it be possible to eliminate all those who use violence or who discriminate against or hate their brother, or who are greedy, or indifferent to others' pain? Jesus worried about preserving the wheat, because this represented the worthy harvest of souls for God. The Kingdom is about this harvest of justice, preserving the good, while allowing the harvest master to make the final judgment.

The bills of the Parish do not take a vacation, and you remembering your summer envelope is very important for the financial well-being of the parish. During the summertime, when all of us have a more leisurely pace, please do not forget to come to Mass and thank God for the many blessings we enjoy in our lives. Your generosity is greatly appreciated. May God bless your efforts on behalf of your parish.

**St. Vincent de Paul Activity** - The St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry over the last five years, from January through June 2010 to the present January through June 2014, has seen an increase of 65% in the number of clients helped. The number of grocery bags distributed in that same time has gone from 300 bags in 2010 to the present time of January through June 2014 to 514. That is an 80% increase.

Remember that the summer months do not mean fewer clients come to the Food Pantry. It is harder on clients with children because they now have to provide lunches for their children while they are out of school. Please remember the Food Pantry the next time that you are at the grocery store and see sales on cereal, peanut butter, jelly, canned chicken, tuna, boxed potatoes, spaghetti, sauce, macaroni and cheese, and canned fruit and vegetables. Donations of any nonperishable food items are needed to help keep the pantry shelves stocked.

Don't forget, your monthly envelope also helps to buy items for the pantry.

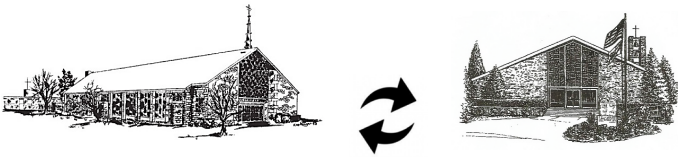
**Congratulations!** To Helen and John Dineen on their 51st Wedding Anniversary. May God continue to bless them for many more years.

**Collection for St. Vincent de Paul:** The St. Vincent de Paul would like to thank everyone who donated money to their collection this past weekend after Mass. The total amount collected was \$773.00. Your generosity is much appreciated!

**Summer Capital Improvements** - During the past two weeks, a new asphalt shingle roof has been installed on the rectory and a new rubber membrane roof will be installed on the flat section of the garage roof. The rectory shingles, after fifty years, have deteriorated considerably and last summer (already) there had been leaks into the parish office. The total contract for these repairs is approximately \$17,000.00.

Cleaning and maintenance of St. Philip School building continues. The ground floor ceiling, which showed considerable deterioration (and dirt) has been repainted (air brushed). The repainting of the ceiling included the cafeteria, as well as the front, ground level hallway ceiling across the front portion of the school. The total cost for this cleaning and painting project was \$2,700.00.

All the classroom and hallway walls are also being repainted. The previous tenants, had painted their own choice of colors in the halls - and the classrooms have been in need of cleaning and painting for some time. The parish intends to work with the new tenants to maintain the school in better condition. All this work will not be able to be accomplished prior to the beginning of the school year.



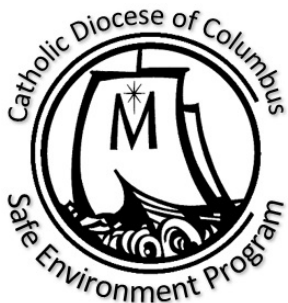
## Our Shared Parish Events and Information
