

#### From the Pastor's Desk...

Today's Gospel contains one of the most famous verses of Scripture, John 3:16: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, that everyone who believes in him might not perish, but might have eternal life." It is good to read that passage and remind ourselves that God loved (and still loves) the world – with all its scars, imperfections, and open wounds.

The world is not the cosmic stage for all evil and its triumph. The world, loved by God, is where all people work out their salvation. Jesus, the Son of God, came into this world and gave us the great gift of God's love.

It is interesting to note that Nicodemus, the Pharisee, came to Jesus at night, for fear of the Jews. In his conversation, Jesus tells Nicodemus that he (Jesus) is the light come into the darkness of this world and that he wishes all people to come into the light. The guiding image of light, which enlightens the mind and the world, allows us to behold the cross, the great symbol of God's love for the world. The cross is the great icon (symbol) of the enormity of God's love for the world. The cross represents total giving, total sacrifice, total surrender for our sakes. So much did God love (and still loves) this world.
