

#### From the Pastor's Desk...

Everyone discovers that there is great difficulty in living out one's vocation – or – calling in life. We all share the common vocation of "discipleship," being dedicated to God and the gospel of His Son, Jesus Christ. The letter from the Hebrews (today's Second Reading) tells us He Jesus, too, had difficulty living out the call and will of the Father. The reading tells us He offered prayers and supplications to God in the face of His impending death on the cross. Jesus experienced human weakness – the fear of death – when the "hour" of His death was approaching. Jesus struggled with His vocation.

We all live in this fear of death. It is a human reality. This fear motivates our actions for self-preservation, doing all we can to protect and extend our lives. But, like Jesus, we can only save our true selves when we let go of everything else we would like to hold onto in this world. In those final days, Jesus, knew His end was near. But He goes and remains in Jerusalem anyway. The purpose of the life and death of Jesus Christ was to point out to all of us the way beyond this world – a world in which we are always caught up in the innumerable worries, concerns, and "unfinished business." For Jesus and for His disciples, glory awaits. When we give up everything, then we begin to understand our eternal destiny.

What is to come? Consider the image of the grain of wheat. When the seed is set into the ground, it becomes something entirely different. Every kind of seed is changed, and transformed, when planted. It produces beautiful flowers, wonderful fruits and vegetables. That, in a sense – is the purpose, the vocation of a seed. After our death, we attain our true vocation – life with God for all eternity. Then we, too, fulfil the purpose for which God called us to live in this world. All this life's care and worries, concerns and problems are no more. It is a struggle for us as it was for Jesus.
