From the Pastor's Desk...

The Gospel of Luke has the Ascension of Jesus taking place on the day of the Resurrection itself. In his other work, the Acts of the Apostles, Jesus ascends into heaven after 40 days. The timeline is not the important thing here. What matters is this. We have not been left behind as orphans, without Jesus. We are, however, as Jesus says "witnesses of these things."

What exactly are we witnesses of? The first disciples had witnessed the power of God in the life and ministry of Jesus Christ. Jesus had taught the mercy and forgiveness of God. He lived it and demonstrated it. Jesus was the face and compassion of God for the poor, the troubled, and the outsider. Jesus Christ made visible the grace of God, empowering disciples to actions of selfless love, love above and beyond love of self. Jesus Christ was, for us, the Father made visible.

This work is now our own. In the first reading, the two men dressed in white garments asked the disciples: "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there, looking at the sky?" It is time to get to work. We are the witness by faith who must spread the gospel news to the very ends of the earth. The task is enormous and there is much to do. Let's get at it and stick to the task at hand. We are witnesses of these things.
