From the Pastor's Desk...

At first reflection, it might appear that Jesus is seeking feedback from his disciples. After the crowds hear his preaching and witness his ministry, he asks them: "Who do the crowds say that I am?" In other words, what label, what identity do the crowds give Jesus? After all the crowds (and the disciples) have witnessed, what do they hold Jesus for? Who do they think he is?

Jesus, after listening to their responses, then rebukes the disciples, especially Peter. He had identified Jesus as "the Christ of God." We know how we understand this title of Jesus, from our faith. Christ means "the anointed one," an individual with a special God-given ministry, with a divine purpose. In the first century Palestine, however, the Christ of God suggested the long awaited Messiah - a warrior, soldier king - who would conquer the hated Roman occupier of Israel. This was certainly not the identity Jesus sought.

Jesus claims his identity from what he will do and what will happen to him. He must suffer, be rejected, be killed and be raised. This is certainly a shocking self-identity and not one the disciples are ready to embrace. For the disciples, however, it only gets worse. If they would wish to follow Jesus, they must deny the importance of self, take up their crosses daily, and then follow him.

Discipleship - following Jesus - commands a price. The purest identification of the true Christian is placing all else in life ahead of one's own personal gain. We live in a commercial world where we, quite naturally, look for a discount, a "50% off" price tag. We also look for shortcuts, and the easy way out. Discipleship can never ask, "What is in this for me?" Discipleship comes with a very high price tag. The Gospel today places this challenge before us. What are we willing to pay to bear the name "Christian"?



Please pray for the victims. Their faith and belief in God are known to God alone. These young men and women were our fellow countrymen. We trust in a God of mercy and compassion.


Please pray for their family members and friends. Their sense of loss and sadness are unimaginable. Place yourself in the shoes of these people.
