From the Pastor's Desk...

Philip, the Apostle, plays an important role in today's Gospel. In a real way, he represents all of us when confronted with enormous problems, seemingly insurmountable odds, and limited resources. When asked by Jesus, "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" Philip responds that six months worth of hard earned money would not be enough to feed the crowd which had followed Jesus. He was testing Philip, the Gospel says, to observe how he (Philip) would respond to enormous need, with scarce resources and limited faith.

It is certain that Jesus had the actions of the prophet Elisha in mind when he tested Philip and the second apostle, Andrew, who minimized the value of five loaves and two fishes for so many people. Elisha, when confronted by his servant who insisted that there was too little food to feed the assembled crowd, simply believed what God had told him. It was God who spoke when he said, "They shall eat and there shall be some left over." In fact, with God, there is always some left over.

Human imagination and human resources always seem limited. Perhaps it is a reluctance to share; perhaps it stems from a limited feel for abundance and generosity; perhaps it comes from pure greed. When resources and goods are in short supply, one often hears that everyone should be self-reliant and self-sustaining. We believe that it is simply common sense to provide abundantly for self and limit what might be portioned out to another.

Today's Gospel from John begins a long section on the larger meaning of the Eucharist for the Christian community. Giving to people what is needed physically allows people to see with the eyes of God, whose abundant outpouring fulfills all human needs, with much left over. We look beyond the material and physical and begin to comprehend a spiritual and divine abundance intended for all, not just the few. Faith enables us to envision the impossible happening through us. The next time we hesitate, hold back or even adamantly refuse to allow a generous outpouring from ourselves, we need to seek a lesson in God's ways, who has blessed us with enough for everyone.

Our BAA Campaign at Holy Spirit continues to make good progress. We currently stand at \$96,289.00, which means we are \$47,545.00 over our goal and will receive this pledged money back to Holy Spirit for our capital repair needs.

More remains to be done, however; if you notice, only 182 families or 29% of our registered parishioners have committed to this campaign, which helps the Diocese and ourselves. We will receive a challenge grant of \$25,000.00 – if the remainder of the sum we need to reach \$128,744.96 -- \$7,455.96 – can be contributed by the 71% of the parish that has not yet responded to the appeal.

NO gifts is too small and the maintenance of the buildings at Holy Spirit is the responsibility of all of us. Please pray for the continued success of our campaign to meet our needs at Holy Spirit Parish.

While the Church has not moved from its understanding of Christian marriage between a man and a woman, civil law in the United States now has a new understanding of what constitutes "marriage." I fully intend to speak on this topic at a weekend Mass in the near future. I do not want to sound misinformed or without a clear understanding of what exactly is at stake on this issue.
