### From Pastor's Desk...

The question at the heart of today's Gospel posed by the rich young man is an important one: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus' answer is instructive. He asks the young man if he knew the commandments of God, to which the man replied that he knew them and followed them from his youth.

Jesus knew, however, what was most important in this man's life. His life obviously must have revolved around his wealth and possessions. Jesus tells him to go and sell all that he has, give it to the poor and then come, and follow Jesus. The young man in question was obviously disappointed. He turned away from Jesus and decided not to follow Him, because he had many possessions. The disciples as well were amazed and shocked, perhaps not so much because they were wealthy (they were not), but perhaps because they always wished they were.

Jesus knew that something big stood in the way of this young man's quest for heaven. Jesus knew what was most important in his life. Furthermore, the young man believed that he could earn his way to eternal life, as if the attainment of life with God was some kind of competition or contest. Jesus knew that for those who were convinced of their own self-worth, or talents or good looks or popularity it would be hard for them to get into eternal life. Why?

Life with God is not something earned because of our accomplishments or merits. No, eternal life is a gift from God. It is a grace that can only be earned through the struggle of discipleship, the denial of self and the willingness to accept the crosses of life. Eternal life comes only at a price, and that price is that all else in life must be set aside, especially one's own dreams, hopes, possessions, and accomplishments. It seems too difficult for us and the disciples and the rich young man. That is why, however, Jesus told His disciples: For human beings, yes, it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God.

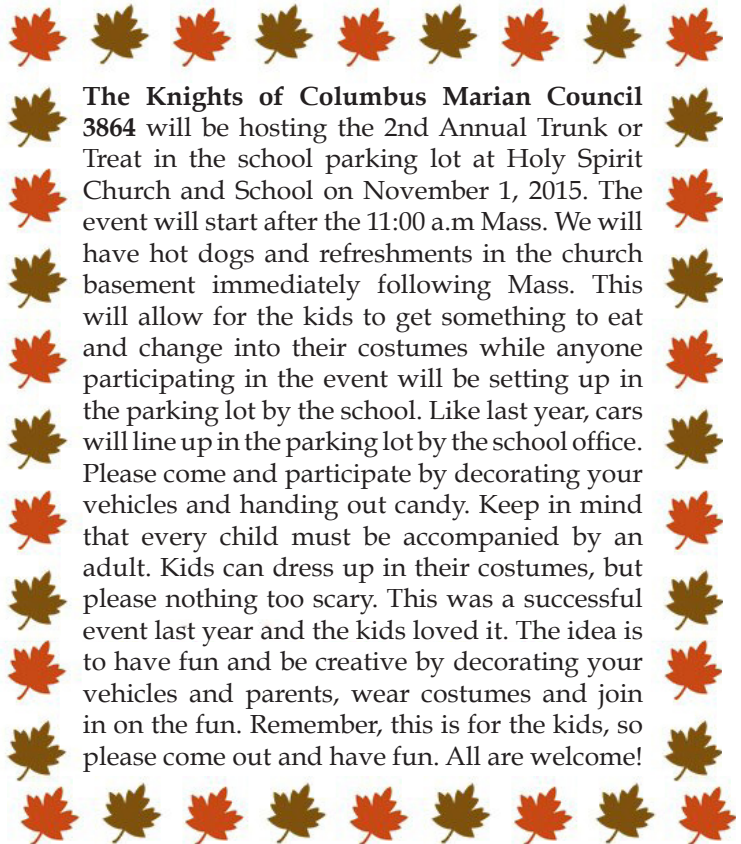
