From the Pastor's Desk...

In understanding today's Gospel, some may choose to focus on the "inappropriate" dress the one wedding guest comes wearing, which eventually gets him thrown out of the banquet hall. Such a discussion usually raises hackles among many who always have chosen more formal, event-appropriate attire as opposed to those whose whole wardrobe is more relaxed and less formal. In today's society, it is hard to come to an agreement about that topic!

Instead, I would like to emphasize the opening lines of the Gospel. "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast... to summon the invited guests but they refused to come... some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business..." Some of us are beset with many invitations and with too many planned activities, which get in the way. An invitation should always be considered an honor, a sign of inclusion, a sign that one's presence is wanted.

God has invited all of us to take our place in the Kingdom. God invites us today to be His presence to others. God invites us to be the visible sign of mercy, generosity, and compassion in an oftentimes cruel and indifferent world. God's invitation may not always be for the enjoyment of good things and good times. God also challenges us, calls us out of our complacency, invites us to bear the crosses of others. The Gospel draws our attention today to divine invitations in our lives that we may be choosing to ignore.

Synod of Bishops on the Family, 2014. This past week, Pope Francis has been meeting with a select group of 250 Bishops from around the world. This is an "extraordinary" session, which according to Church law is convened to deal with matters "which require a speedy solution" for the good of the universal Church. The topic is "the pastoral challenges of the family in the context of evangelization."

The past fifty years have seen enormous changes in the structure of families across the globe, especially here in the United States. There exist pressing issues for the everyday pastoral work of priests in parishes, especially the challenge of separation, divorce, unmarried heads of families, single parents, and participation in the Eucharist for remarried Catholics, who do not have annulments. Families everywhere are confronted by unemployment, financial hardship, and oftentimes both parents working.

Next fall, October 2015, a General Synod of Bishops will meet in Rome (a much larger group) to consider the proposals of this extraordinary session now taking place. Please keep these current and upcoming deliberations of the bishops in your prayers. Pray that they will be open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit.
