## From the Pastor's Desk...

**Prayers for West Africa.** I propose a more adult, more Christian approach concerning the recent "Ebola Crisis," which has been so widely reported in the American Press.

Jesus reassured His disciples on numerous occasions how they were to confront the challenges of life and discipleship. He told them: "Do not be afraid!" What we should be experiencing in our country is a reasoned, educational process concerning the potential public health danger. The recent press conferences, news releases and public discussion concerning a potential health crisis have also featured a good measure of fear and political posturing on many fronts. The atmosphere and histrionics surrounding the Ebola virus bear strong resemblance of the A.I.D.S. virus in the early 1980's.

Individuals can and should render their own judgments concerning the response of government agencies and our public officeholders of all political persuasions. The fact remains, that of this writing, there are only three diagnosed individuals in our country, only one of whom has unfortunately died (the man who traveled here from Liberia, Africa). Some regrettable and unfortunate missteps occurred during the course of his treatment. Courage and dialogue – not politics – should describe our response in this "crisis."

As Christians, we should pray for the people of Liberia and Sierra Leone in West Africa. Their population and health care systems have been overwhelmed by this outbreak. The nearly 5,000 deaths in those countries testify to the need for greater international relief and efforts. The level of public awareness and concern surrounding the Ebola virus spiked in our country only after these three cases surfaced on American soil.

Pray for the families, the orphans, the public health workers in these countries. Pray for the success of American efforts (by our voluntary military) to build hospitals and care centers. Pray that our Congress will allocate the needed additional funding. The suffering in West Africa is real and widespread. This disease must be confronted where it started. We should not permit our media and our divided politics to overwhelm our Christian conscience, our sense of reason, and respect for each other in this country.

### **The Gospel of the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time.**

Today's Gospel contains an oft heard phrase. "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind"; and "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Remember that in the Gospel of Luke (parable of the Good Samaritan), Jesus defines neighbor as everyone, not just the person next door, or family members and friends, or those who do us favors. Everyone.

Remember that when we see our neighbors as God sees them, we will treat them with the compassion of God. We may grow weary of hearing this, but the poor, the outcasts and outsiders are the special object of exclusion in every society. How we welcome and embrace the weak and vulnerable makes all the difference in our relationship with God. How can we say we love God, whom we have never seen, if we do not love our neighbor, who is always present in our lives?
