## From the Pastor's Desk...

Today marks the anniversary of the dedication of the Cathedral Church of Rome. The church is known as the Basilica of St. John Lateran, dedicated to St. John the Baptist on land donated by the Laterani family of Rome back in the year 324 A.D. It is the cathedral church in which Pope Francis is the Bishop of Rome. The Holy Father has dedicated much of his time since election as Pope to tending the needs of the people of Rome, as he has urged fellow bishops to do likewise in their own dioceses.

All three readings today feature the word “temple.” The structure in Jerusalem was a special and sacred place in Judaism. It was God’s dwelling place on earth, and its grand architecture and elaborate décor were intended as a reflection of the grandeur of God. The Jerusalem temple was the very heart and center of the Jewish nation. It’s destruction in 563 B.C. and again in 70 A.D. were, for the Jewish people, catastrophic events in their history.

The great cathedrals of human construct would be mere museums of great art were it not for their intended purpose: houses of prayer and worship which reflect the majesty of God. The cost of their construction and maintenance has provoked more than one debate about the funds which might go for better purposes, such as the care of the poor and hungry. It would be a mistake, however, to confine God to the four walls of any Church and miss the point of these readings: God’s dwelling is with his people, more specifically, in us.

St. Paul wrote the Corinthians: “You are God’s building.” In today’s Gospel, Jesus refers to the temple of his own body, declaring resurrection as the future of the mortal human body, specifically his own. The dignity of the person (and the human body) is based upon the sacred nature of our own bodies, made so by the indwelling of the Spirit of God. Thus the reason for the “incensing” of the deceased body of loved ones at a funeral Mass. We need to recognize all the more the sacred nature of the temple of the body, especially in the broken and neglected bodies of the poor, the elderly, and the victims of disease. In these, the least of our brothers and sisters, we encounter the presence of God.
