

From the Pastor's Desk...

In the Old Testament, hospitality to strangers, travelers, and migrants was important. In Biblical times, such wanderers experienced untold hardships: journeys were long and hard; water and food on the journey were scarce; there were no convenience services, no police, and lots of potential robbers. The Hebrews were always admonished to treat strangers with respect and, of course, hospitality.

Strangers and travelers, in turn, reciprocated with gratitude or a gift in return for the hosts' generosity. Abraham and Sarah's kindness is rewarded, as these strange guests are revealed as messengers of God, telling Abraham and Sarah that in their advanced years they shall conceive and bear a son. Abraham's faithfulness and hospitality are rewarded because of his kindness. God will bless him abundantly.

It is a simple story with enormous meaning for us today. The humanitarian crisis on the U.S./Mexico border should move all Christians to practice the radical love of neighbor which Jesus instructed His disciples to practice. This is also true for some nine million refugees who have been displaced within Ukraine and Eastern European countries because of the Russian invasion. We must extend God's mercy and compassion to all, especially to the stranger, the migrant, and the refugee. Consider what St. Paul wrote in his letter to the Hebrews:

"Let mutual love continue. Do not neglect hospitality, for through it some have unknowingly entertained angels" (Hebrews 13:1-3)

Having a Child Baptized?

Here at Holy Spirit, we have some helpful guidelines in preparing a family to have their child baptized.

- All parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class. The class is offered on the Second Wednesday of every month at 7:00 p.m. in the parish office. Preregistration for this class is required. Call 614-861-1521 to register for the class.
- In order to register for the Baptism Preparation Class, the parents must be registered parishioners of Holy Spirit for at least 6 months. If you are not currently registered, we can assist you and register you for an upcoming class.
- Generally, Baptisms take place after 11:00 a.m. Mass on the first and last Sundays of the month. Please note that other children may be baptized on the same day as your child. We do not baptize during the season of Lent. We also do not schedule Baptisms on Sundays that take place near Holy Days or major holidays.
- The Sacrament may be celebrated in English or Spanish. Please understand that a Baptism may be scheduled in another language on the Sunday you desire. Your child's Baptism may need to be scheduled on another Sunday.

WITNESSES TO FREEDOM BLESSED MIGUEL PRO

- "Viva Cristo Rey!"

As he faced a firing squad for serving the Catholic faithful in Mexico at a time when Catholicism was outlawed and severely persecuted, Fr. Miguel Pro of the Society of Jesus made a request. He asked to have a moment to pray on his knees, then he stood up, stretched out his arms in the imitation of Christ on the cross and submitted himself to his martyrdom, shouting "Viva Christo Rey!"

This moment was photographed, and so we can look into the face of a martyr at the moment of his execution. What is astonishing about the images is the serenity with which Blessed Miguel submits himself to the state. He does not respond with violent resistance, because he is at peace with God. From that place of peace, the martyr triumphs over tyranny.

Due in part to Blessed Miguel's witness, the Mexican government was shamed and an uprising gained the strength to stand up to religious persecution, as well as other injustices. He did not know it at the time, but his death inspired a larger defense of political and religious freedom.

Freedom through surrender is a paradox that is hard to understand and at times harder to live. Nonetheless, we are all called, like Blessed Miguel, to live in the freedom that only comes through an imitation of Christ's faithful obedience.

Blessed Miguel's life and death remains a witness to complete surrender to Christ in a way to which we might struggle to relate. Yet, we are all called to order our lives to Christ. We may not be asked to die for our faith, but we are asked to give each moment of the day to the Lord. This capacity requires freedom from sin, freedom from selfishness, freedom from all those things that stand between us and God.

Blessed Miguel Pro reminds us that even in extreme circumstances, we find true freedom when we live first for Christ. That witness, when adopted in our lives, may even inspire others to similar acts of love. Blessed Miguel Pro, pray for us!




