

From the Pastor's Desk...

Jerusalem, the Holy City, is the goal of Jesus' journey in the Gospel of Luke. The narrative of his Gospel describes Jesus' teaching and ministry with the disciples as He makes His way there. In today's first reading, Jerusalem is seen as the source of comfort and salvation. Indeed, the City was in so many ways just that for the Jews. It was the location of their Temple and the goal of many devout Jews at Passover time.

It is also the end goal of the ministry of Jesus. There on the cross He will teach His disciples the true meaning of discipleship and self-sacrifice. But before He sends His disciples out to teach and preach, He wants them to be keenly aware of the true meaning of discipleship. They too, must be willing to take up their cross. He wants the disciples to be dedicated to proclaiming the Good News, and so He gives them important advice:

The harvest of people to be won is abundant, but the laborers are few. They (the disciples) may feel overwhelmed and undercompensated, but they will be amazed at the results.

Jesus sends them like lambs into a pack of wolves. They would always encounter great hostility and even death and persecution, but they are the beloved sheep of the Shepherd. He is challenging them to no easy task.

Their dedication and devotion precluded any worry about material things, their own personal comfort, or even concern about apparent failure or rejection. The important thing was to announce the presence of God's kingdom, all else would take care of itself.

Finally, they were to work humbly. Proclaiming the Gospel does not mean making headlines, becoming famous, or winning admiration. Often in American culture, the flashiest preacher and wealthiest Churches with the largest congregations are seen as most successful and popular. Proclaiming the kingdom and making it a reality in the world requires steadfast small steps, without applause, but with dedication and devotion. This remains the humble work of Christians today.
