From the Pastor's Desk...

Today's Gospel needs to be explained and interpreted correctly. Too often, the words of Jesus have been understood as a call to conflict, and as a call to an aggressive, if not violent, Christian response to opposition against the Gospel. Nothing could be further from the "Gospel truth."

The ministry and preaching of Jesus was a message of forgiveness, reconciliation, and mercy. However, Jesus warned His disciples that the Gospel would meet enormous opposition and it has been so received throughout centuries with suffering and martyrdom. In our times, Christians in so many countries have endured bloodshed and death, even more so than in the early centuries of the Church at the hands of Roman emperors.

Jesus understood this. He predicted His own suffering and death at the hands of enemies, and the disciples flatly rejected that very notion. In today's first reading, the prophet Jeremiah predicts the triumph of Jerusalem's enemies over her. The prophet is dispatched to a muddy cistern, because he had "demoralized the troops" of Israel confronting her enemies. Jerusalem was of course conquered, pillaged, and burned to the ground by the Babylonians in 586 B.C.

In today's second reading, St. Paul urged the early Christians to "persevere in running the race that lies before us," even though "you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding blood." The authentic living of Christian faith runs against or counter to our culture. Catholics and all Christians make a grave error when they believe that persecution calls for aggressive counter measures. We are to endure patiently in faith, "keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith." Remember what Christians are to do: love God and love our neighbor.

The Assumption Of Mary: Monday, August 15 is the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This dogma of faith, proclaimed by Pope Pious XII in 1954, professes our belief in the bodily resurrection and glorification of Mary, the Mother of God. It is not a Holy Day of obligation this year. There will be one Mass

at 9:00 a.m. at St. Philip the Apostle Church on Monday, August 15, 2022. The belief about Mary was not "invented" or formulated in the modern Church. In early Church tradition, this feast was known as the "Dormition," or falling asleep of Mary, indicating her death. But the early Church believed that the mortal body of Mary was preserved from corruption in the grave, because of her great privilege of becoming the Mother of God.

Fr. William Faustner, age 74, died on July 31, 2022. Fr. Faustner was ordained by Bishop Edward Herrmann on May 29, 1976 at Corpus Christi Church (Columbus). Fr. Faustner had varied priestly ministry, which included: Associate Pastor, Immaculate Conception Church (Dennison), with teaching duties at Tuscarawas Central Catholic High School; Associate Pastor, St. Paul Church (Westerville); St. Michael Church (Worthington); Our Lady of Peace Church (Columbus); St. Mary Magdalene Church (Columbus); and Administrator pro-tem of St. Francis of Assisi Church (Columbus); Associate Pastor of Christ the King Church (Columbus); Pastor, Immaculate Conception Church (Kenton); and St. Francis DeSales Church (Newcomertstown). He served as chaplain at Riverside Methodist, Mount Carmel West and OSU Hospitals. The Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated for Fr. Faustner on Wednesday, August 3 at St. Timothy Church by Bishop Earl Fernandes and priests of the Diocese. Burial will take place at a later date in the family plot at Resurrection Cemetery in Wescosville, Pennsylvania.

Fr. Michael Gribble, age 79, died on August 3, 2022. Fr. Gribble was ordained on May 16, 1981 at St. Francis de Sales Church (Newark) by Bishop Edward Hermann. During his 40-plus years of dedicated service, Fr. Gribble served as Associate Pastor, Sacred Heart Parish (New Philadelphia); Associate Pastor, Saint Mary Parish (Groveport), with teaching duties at Father Wehrle High School (Columbus); Pastor, Holy Rosary/Saint John Parish (Columbus); Pastor, Saint Edward the Confessor Parish, and Chaplain, Denison University (Granville); and Rector, and Saint Joseph Cathedral (Columbus). The Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated on Tuesday. August 9th, at St. Francis de Sales Church in Newark concelebrated by Bishop Earl K. Fernandes, Bishop James Griffin, Bishop Frederick Campbell, and priests of the Diocese. Burial took place on Wednesday, August 10, at Saint Joseph Cemetery in Newark.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.



Teachers Needed for PSR this Fall: The Parish School of Religion (PSR) is our religious




