From the Pastor's Desk...

Inclusion, not exclusion, is everyone's wish. The knowledge that a person belongs, is not overlooked or left out, is important to us all. Our communities and the larger world are big, overwhelming places. Inclusion guarantees a place, security, and notice. One is not being overlooked.

The meaning of today's Gospel, however, does not turn on the exclusion of the man knocking on the door, then being told by the master of the home that it's too late, the door is locked. It was several Sundays ago when the Gospel told us to ask, to seek, to keep on knocking, and that persistence is always rewarded. Jesus has not changed His mind. Rather, this Gospel is directed at us, believers, "wanna be" disciples, who need to understand clearly what salvation means and the price to be paid.

The Gospel text begins with a question from an onlooker in the crowd: "Lord, will only a few be saved?" Jesus responds that to obtain salvation, enter the narrow gate. His response describes the challenge and difficulty of entering the narrow gate. Furthermore, He teaches that the gate does not remain open long. Many are invited, He adds, but not all choose the narrow gate.

What does Jesus mean when He tells those knocking on the door that it remains locked and they are too late? Jesus is speaking directly to us, the "baptized" in the choir, so to speak. We may think that our place is assured; that because we come to Church, volunteer, and say our prayers, that surely we are among the saved and included. It is not about all that. Just being familiar with Jesus and faith does not matter. What matters is a life lived at all times for God and others, in word and deed. Truly, this is the difficult, narrow gate.

The Gospel addresses the resistance to the non-believers (Gentiles) being invited to become Christian. We do not determine whom God calls to the table in the kingdom. Our self-righteousness, which may show itself in our "familiarity" with Jesus, may stand in the way. Certainly, we have dined at the altar table, we have observed Christmas, and we have friends in the parish. Admission to the kingdom is, however, through the narrow gate. Our admission ticket is a sincere, contrite heart, a life lived fully for God and others. God alone is the judge and gatekeeper.


