

From the Pastor's Desk...

Consider three quotes from this week's scripture readings on the Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time:

"Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and the evidence of things not seen." (Hebrews 11:1)

The Apostle Paul recalls the complete dependence of Abraham upon God, who sends him and his family forth into a strange land and an unknown future. The disciples too, being prepared for discipleship, are urged in the Gospel to cast aside fear and uncertainty, and realize the great promise entrusted to them:

"Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom. Sell your belongings and give alms." (Luke 12:32)

In the Gospels of the past several weeks, Jesus has impressed on His listeners the importance of casting worldly values aside and to seek first the Kingdom. He urges them to seek "inexhaustible treasure" in heaven, and if that is their first priority, all else will be given them as well. Discipleship is a total commitment, and Jesus knew that the faint of heart or the half-committed would simply drop away, as did so many of His listeners.

The total reliance upon God needs to describe the faith of each one of us who reads this column. And because we hope for the riches and treasures of the kingdom, which are hard for us to conceive of, we must always depend upon the great faith required for our journey to Jerusalem with Jesus. We also must realize the importance of God's generous gifts to us and the obligation they bring:

"Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more." (Luke 12:48)

The Assumption Of Mary: Monday, August 15th is the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This dogma of faith, proclaimed by Pope Pious XII in 1954, professes our belief in the bodily resurrection and glorification of Mary, the Mother of God. It is not a Holyday of Obligation this year. There will be one Mass at 9:00 a.m. at St. Philip the Apostle Church on Monday, August 15, 2022.

The belief about Mary was not "invented" or formulated in the modern Church. In early Church tradition, this feast was known as the "Dormition" or falling asleep of Mary, indicating her death. But the early Church believed that the mortal body of Mary was preserved from corruption in the grave, because of her great privilege of becoming the Mother of God.


