

From the Pastor's Desk...

This Sunday's Gospel for the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time returns us to St. Luke's Gospel, the "C" cycle of readings in the Church's three year calendar. Where we pick up in Luke's Gospel is odd because we just completed the Easter season. Today's Gospel tells us that Jesus wants to go to Jerusalem to fulfill His life's mission: suffering, death and Resurrection.

Today's Gospel describes the exacting demands of discipleship and how difficult it really is to live out that choice. He sets out on His last long journey to Jerusalem which makes up the remainder of Luke's Gospel. He quite naturally wondered who would follow Him. This journey begins ominously, as the old antagonisms between Jesus and the Samaritans resurfaces, and they would not welcome Him. We can also assume that the Jewish opposition to Jesus was organized to silence His ministry. His followers begin to dwindle in numbers.

Discipleship, as described by Jesus for these remaining few, will be difficult. James and John are invited to learn forgiveness and not seek revenge on the inhospitable Samaritans. They will experience homelessness, unlike the animals of the fields and forest. Family ties will become a hindrance to discipleship.

Finally, discipleship means "no looking back." If the plowman in the field were to look backwards, the furrows he cut would be crooked. Take this image from farming and apply it to the spiritual life. Whether we long for "the good old days" when things seemed better or simpler, or whether we carry past regret or guilt, Jesus tells us: let it go. Detaching from what lies behind us enables us to look forward to what is more important, following Jesus. We must always remember our God lies before us, not in our past.


