From the Pastor's Desk...

The parable in today's Gospel is difficult to understand. One might get the impression, at first hearing, that Jesus is praising the dishonesty of the steward (or manager) that is being fired by the rich man, who owns the estate. As the manager is being dismissed, he reduces the debt of the tenants (those who work on the estate) owed to the landowner.

It was not uncommon for land tenants to owe a certain percentage of their produce (or crops) to the land owner. Most likely, the unjust steward had demanded more from the tenants than was actually owed the rich man, pocketing the "extra" he charged for himself. In reducing their debt, the unjust steward had restored a sense of fairness and respect between the tenants and the rich man. On the way out the door, he stops skimming and over charging, which is commendable. He reduces debt owed by the tenants to the landowner.

There are two lessons to be had from today's Gospel. The first would be that dishonesty knows no distinction between dishonesty in large matters as opposed to small matters. Little "white" lies or cheating on small sums of money are often excused, overlooked, or even seen as accepted and commonplace. On this point the Gospel is clear: a person trustworthy in small matters is also trustworthy in great ones, and the person dishonest in small matters is also dishonest in great ones.

The second lesson is a bit more subtle. In every age, good and upright people often forget that the God who entrusted or blessed them with wealth also commanded them to share those gifts. The steward who was a crook understood that at least, as he forgave his master's debtors. He understands the good that can come out of generosity. We should understand that lesson as well in our lives.

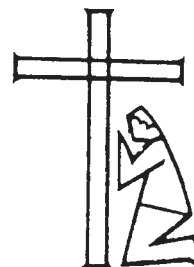

National Migration Week September 20-25, 2022: For nearly a half century, the Catholic Church in the United States has celebrated National Migration Week, which is an opportunity for the Church to reflect on the circumstances confronting migrants, including immigrants, refugees, children, and victims and survivors of human trafficking.

Unfortunately, in our contemporary culture, we often fail to encounter migrants as persons, and instead look at them as unknown others, if we even notice them at all. We do not take the time to engage migrants in a meaningful way, as fellow children of God, but remain aloof to their presence and suspicious or fearful of them. During this National Migration Week, let us all take the opportunity to engage migrants as community members, neighbors, and friends.

We Americans currently are engaged in a great debate about legal (and illegal) immigration. We are supposed to be, as Christians, people of conscience and Gospel faith. As I often have said from the pulpit, we need to see and love all people as God sees and loves them. We should apply our Christian moral beliefs to how we treat people – what could be simpler than that? Every nation has the right to protect its borders in a lawful and legitimate way. As Catholics, we must demonstrate mercy and compassion. I do not think these values contradict each other.



Pope John Paul I Beatified: Cardinal Albino Luciani was elected pope on August 26, 1978 to succeed his predecessor, Pope Paul VI, who had died earlier that same month. John Paul I's pontificate was one of the shortest on record – 34 days. He died on September 28, 1978. This past Sunday, he was beatified by Pope Francis,

bringing him closer to possible sainthood. His was an all too brief time upon the throne of St. Peter. He was succeeded in October of 1978 by Pope John Paul II.



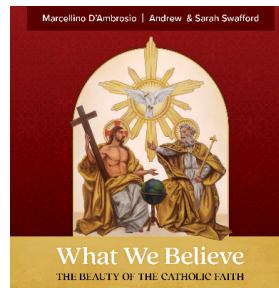

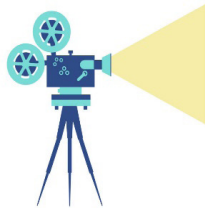

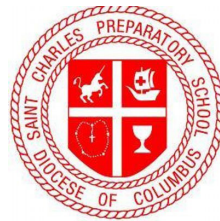
