





#### From the Pastor's Desk...

In the readings from Amos the prophet and the Gospel of Luke, we are introduced to a God who watches over the weakest, neediest, and the neglected in the world. God would prefer, of course, that we join in and offer the special protection He bestows on the widow, the orphan, and the stranger. What often stands in our way is complacency. We get so caught up in the enjoyment of the blessings of our good life that we become indifferent and simply do not care. We often hope, if not demand, that these special ones of God take care of themselves.

Hear again what the prophet Amos wrote in the first reading. The prophet warns those who lie upon "beds of ivory, stretched comfortably on their couches, eat lambs taken from the flock and calves from the stall," have become too comfortable. The blessings they enjoy – the wine, the perfumed oils and posh lifestyle have made them insensitive to the needs of others and events around them. The prophet reminds them that all this one day could be taken away.

Certainly, one of the saddest Gospel parables is the story we hear today from Luke. Lazarus, ignored and abandoned, sits in plain sight of the rich man, who is finely dressed and sumptuously wellfed. The only relief Lazarus might seek, covered with sores licked by dogs, would be scraps from the table. The rest of the story — Lazarus' reward with Abraham after his death and the post-life suffering of the rich man — teaches us that it is not the enjoyment of good things that incurs the wrath of God. It is the indifference and complacency of the rich man to the needs of poor Lazarus that determine his end fate.

The same applies to all of us. The poor will always be with us, as well as the sick, the migrant stranger, street people, and abandoned elderly. Should we grow accustomed to turning a blind eye and overlook these needs, then we have failed. We have forgotten that God has entrusted these people to our care, the people of His special protection. All our blessings could disappear in the blink of an eye. Then, where would we be? Our fortune could be reversed. Who can remain unmoved by the moral tale of poor man Lazarus and the man who chose to ignore him?



A Man for All Seasons (1966): Friday, November 4, 6:30-8:30 p.m. – Adults – This film gives us a glimpse into the final years of St. Thomas More, who was executed for refusing to acknowledge King Henry VIII's supremacy of the Church in England. *Prince of Egypt* (1998): Friday, February 3, 6:30-8:00 p.m. – Kids and Families – Regarded as one of the best Biblical film adaptations of all time, the beautifully animated film follows the life of Moses from being a prince to his ultimate destiny to lead the Jewish people through their exodus out of Egypt.

Au Revoir Les Enfants (1988): Friday, May 5, 6:30-8:30 p.m. – Adults – Based on the actions of Fr. Père Jacques, a French priest and headmaster who attempted to shelter Jewish children during the Holocaust. Appears on the Vatican's List of Great Films.

**Having a child Baptized?** Here at Holy Spirit, we have some helpful guidelines in preparing a family to have their child baptized.

- All parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class. This class is offered on the Second Wednesday of every month at 7:00 p.m. in the parish office. Preregistration for this class is requested at least one week prior to the class.
- In order to register for the Baptism Preparation Class, the parents must be registered parishioners of Holy Spirit for at least 6 months. If you are not currently registered, we can assist you and register you for an upcoming class.
- Generally, Baptisms take place after 11:00 a.m. Mass on the first and last Sundays of the month. Please note that other children may be baptized on the same day as your child. We do not baptize during the season of Lent. We also do not schedule Baptisms on Sundays that take place near Holy Days or major holidays.
- The Sacrament may be celebrated in English or Spanish. Please understand that a Baptism may be scheduled in another language on the Sunday you desire. Your child's Baptism may need to be scheduled on another Sunday.




