From the Pastor's Desk...

In the Gospel from a couple of weeks ago, Jesus urged His listeners "to strive to enter through the narrow gate." Jesus described it as difficult to do, teaching the crowds that being a dedicated disciple was no easy task. The man in the crowd, whom Jesus was answering, mistakenly presumed that because he was familiar with God and the things of God, he would automatically be admitted when he knocked on the door. Dedicated discipleship, Jesus told him, required hard work. But the decision for admission to the kingdom was a gift, not something one earned or deserved.

We all know people who, although they have given up on Church, say they have not given up on Christianity. We also know people who profess to be strong Christians, but whose values and lifestyles seem to contradict authentic Christian belief and faith. In these cases, we need to listen to Pope Francis, who has said, "Who are we to judge?" The Gospel today is addressed to them and to us, and we would be better off to examine the extent of our own commitment to discipleship.

Simply stated: the price and demands of discipleship are high and everyone is not going to be willing – or able – to become an authentic disciple. Jesus urges us in the Gospel today, therefore, to prepare ourselves to become authentic disciples. He uses two images of preparedness. The king marching into battle must have a well-equipped and well-manned army. The builder must ensure that he has the funds and materials to complete the structure in order to avoid public embarrassment.

Discipleship must be the choice above all others, and there may be distractions to pull us away. Following Jesus must be more important than personal relationships, the possession of material goods, or positions of honor and power. It is difficult to carry the personal crosses of our lives and often be asked to carry the crosses of others. With God's grace, however, all things in our lives are possible. God's grace strengthens and transforms – completely – the human person.

Labor Day, Monday, September 5, 2022 Labor Day provides Catholics the opportunity to reflect on the meaning of this day: to honor the dignity and value of human labor, and of course, the workers

who carry the American economy on their backs. Do you know what the Catholic Church teaches about the rights and duties of all workers?

- The rights of workers, like all other rights, are based on the nature of the human person and on the dignity of each worker. The economy of any country should serve the worker (the human person), not the other way around!
- The Church teaches that workers have the right to a just and living wage, the right to a pension and to insurance for old age, sickness, and in work-related accidents.
- The Church believes workers have the right to organize (form a union) and to enter collective bargaining for their wages and working conditions, the right to strike and withhold their labor when they deem it necessary.
- The Church believes current economic systems can, in many ways, cause enormous suffering to workers, assaulting a worker's dignity and the value of our Common Home (this earth!) and sustain the invisible tyranny of money that only guarantees privileges of a few. (Pope Francis)
- As followers of Jesus, we should judge economic choices and institutions by how they protect or undermine the life and dignity of the human person, and serve the common good of all citizens and participants.

A worker owes the employer a good day's work for a fair and living wage. All parents need to teach their children the value of work in shaping not only their future, but also their talents and contributions to the common good of our society.

Prayer for Work on Labor Day:

Creator God, thank You for providing us with the gift to share our talents. Provide our community, our nation, our world, the fortitude to provide work for all which is decent and fair. Make us faithful stewards of Your creation, to enhance the human dignity of our global family. We ask this in the name of Jesus, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit now and forever. 


