





From the Pastor's Desk...

Today's Gospel may seem a bit difficult to understand. It seems to be praising the over-persistent, almost badgering behavior of this widow, asking the judge for justice. Her persistence is praiseworthy. We always admire individuals who stick to it, who press their cause, especially when they do so in a decent, admirable way.

Today's Gospel, however, is not about the widow exclusively. Yes, her entreaty and her personal quest for justice teach us the power of prayer and that prayers are heard. This parable told by Jesus is intended, however, to contrast the behavior of the judge who "feared neither God nor respected any human being" and God, who listens to those no one else can hear.

The somewhat mean-spirited judge gives into the widow and finally grants her request because he is simply tired of being annoyed. He actually fears that she may come and assault him physically! This is hardly the basis for settling any legal dispute, and certainly not the basis for a system of justice. In telling this story, Jesus tells His listeners to "pay attention to what the dishonest judge says."

Contrast this judge to the God who is Jesus Christ. The Gospel invites us to understand God as the one who desires us, the one who seeks us out, the one who wants to fulfill our deepest needs. The God of Jesus invites us to lay down our burdens and concerns. He welcomes our prayers and conversations, because they bring us closer to the God who desires a relationship with us.

God wants us to place trust and confidence in Him. Consider all the people in the world who turn to God, because, quite simply, they have no one else to turn to or no one who considers their needs urgent. It is the folks who have no one else to turn to – the publicly shamed, the poor, the destitute, the broken of this world – who display enormous faith and trust in God. These are the people we need to stand close to. We can learn a lot about faith and determination from those who have little else to rely on.






