From the Pastor's Desk...

It should be the belief of disciples that faith can make a difference. Today's Gospel expresses Jesus' belief that, whether in good times or bad, even the smallest amount of faith can make a profound difference.

Consider the imagery Jesus used. The roots of a mulberry tree are sturdy, tough, and run deep. Uprooting such a tree might seem an impossible task. When confronting an impossible situation, disciples should always respond with faith. Regardless of the situation, whether a personal illness, loss of a job, or a crisis in the family, people of faith respond with faith.

Jesus, however, takes His understanding of faith a step further. He calls for faith which does not seek reward. His example presents a master who expects His servants to do their work without having to thank them for simply doing their duty. Discipleship is its own reward. Such discipleship is selfless. He modeled selfless service and He urges His disciples to accept this standard of faithfulness with the humility of slaves.

Society bestows admiration and reward for commendable acts. Many do what is right and good, all the while accepting praise and applause. The faith of the disciples, however, should be pure. Like the servant who worked a double shift, plowing the fields and serving dinner, the service of the disciple seeks only the glory of God, loyalty to commitment, and the good of the neglected.

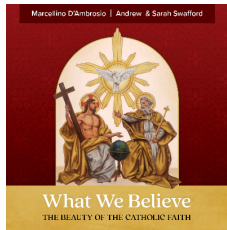
