From the Pastor's Desk...

One of the important things we can do is to be honest with ourselves, and subsequently to know ourselves. The Pharisee in today's Gospel knows well who he is: he is a devout Jew who observes the law; he fasted twice a week as a sign of penance and self-denial; he gave a significant portion of his income as a tithe (one-tenth back to God).

It is clear that the tax-collector knows where he stands: he was reviled by his fellow Jews; he was considered a traitor, as he worked for the Romans; he probably pocketed the extra he charged above and beyond the Roman tax. The self-estimation of these two men was on target. No one would argue with their self-assessments.

The problem for the Pharisee, however, was that he had fallen into the trap many "good people" do. This is the same trap observant people of many religions stumble into. Jesus targeted this problem. Luke writes that Jesus addressed this parable "to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else." The Pharisee trusted his own self-assessment, especially when he compared himself to others and offered thanks to God saying, "I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity."

The tax collector knows that he is a sinner. His prayer for mercy and his sense of humility acknowledge his need for God, not trust in his self-estimation. The Pharisee cannot resist the temptation to consider himself more righteous than others. As a result, he displays an enormous measure of self-assurance that his righteous deeds speak for themselves about how good a person he is.

Mercy will be measured out to us from God, if and only if we acknowledge our dependence on God's mercy and forgiveness. Others who might seek mercy from us depend on our generosity to dispense to them what we ourselves have received. It is the blind pride of the Pharisee which prevents him from recognizing that his holiness comes not from himself but has its origin in God. No one becomes a "good person" by a favorable self-comparison with the lives of others.

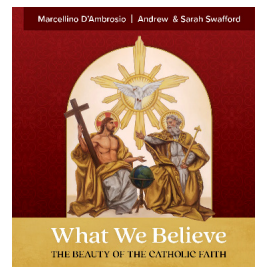

As people formed by the Gospel, we are committed to respecting the gift

of human life, from the moment of conception to the moment of natural death.

Marking the anniversary of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, Pope Francis said the catechism's discussion of the death penalty, already formally amended by St. John Paul II, needs to be even more explicitly against capital punishment.

Capital punishment, he said, "heavily wounds human dignity" and is an "inhuman measure."

"It is, in itself, contrary to the Gospel, because a decision is voluntarily made to suppress a human life, which is always sacred in the eyes of the Creator and of whom, in the last analysis, only God can be the true judge and guarantor," the pope said.

The death penalty, he said, not only extinguishes a human life, it extinguishes the possibility that the person, recognizing his or her errors, will request forgiveness and begin a new life.

The church's position on the death penalty, he said, is one example of how church teaching is not static, but grows and deepens along with a growth in faith and in response to modern questions and concerns.
