





From the Pastor's Desk...

We should not sit in judgement of biblical peoples in their reaction to skin diseases, such as leprosy. In modern times, we too have ostracized fellow citizens for a variety of reasons: the internment camps for Japanese Americans in World War II, AIDS patients in the early 1980's, the proposal to ban Muslims from entering the United States. Such containment, isolation or rejection of any group in any society is done primarily out of fear, an irrational response to an "exaggerated" problem. We know how powerful unfounded fear can be.

Today's readings, however, are about more than fear or even the miraculous healing of Namaan in the first reading, or the ten lepers in the Gospel. Focus attention, if you will, on the response of the one cured leper, a Samaritan, and the other nine, who seemingly walked away, just happy to be cured. The "Samaritan leper" professes not only his belief in Jesus, but returns in gratitude to express appreciation for all Jesus did for him. He knows who cured him and he comes back "to give a return to God" for all he has experienced.

All of us know that saying "thanks" is the right thing to do. Like the ten (former) lepers, usually only a small percentage of people express their gratitude. Parents are supposed to teach their children to write "thank you" notes. For a couple of generations, this has not happened. Is it fair to assume that expressions of gratitude to God have also declined?

The cured Samaritan leper was moved not only by his gratitude for what he had received. He also came to know in his gratitude who Jesus really was and, in turn, who God was. Gratitude can lead us to God. For that reason, it is an important virtue of a faithful person. Our gratitude does not make God feel good – it ennobles us with a greater sense of appreciation for all we have received. Parents – please teach gratitude to your children...for what you, others, and God gives them in their lives.






