From the Pastor's Desk...

The following paragraph describes the tax collector in last week's Gospel and Zacchaeus in this week's Gospel:

"Tax collectors were hated, and tax collectors who were Jews were the most despised of all. To be a tax collector was seen as being a traitor to your people and to your faith. For wages, tax collectors kept a certain percentage of the taxes they collected. 'tax collector' and 'sinner' became synonymous terms."

St. Luke, in his Gospel, loves to play with his readers and their presumptions and expectations. Imagine the astonishment of Jesus' listeners when, in last week's Gospel, He praised the repentant, humble, tax collector. The Pharisee, after all, obeyed all the Jewish Laws, even including tithing and support of the poor. The problem of the Pharisee was his excessive pride, thinking his good actions made him a better person than other sinners.

Zacchaeus, a chief tax collector, was presumed to be a despicable individual. In his encounter with Jesus, however, he stands tall, although somewhat defensively. As it turns out, he is not the thief or sinner Jesus' listeners presumed him to be. The crowd based their opinion of him on what they thought they knew, not the truth about him. As it turned out, he was a generous man, especially to the needy. And he was ready to pay back four-fold anyone he might have cheated. This was not the picture the naysayers and critics of Zacchaeus had.

Jesus reached out to Zacchaeus. Jesus certainly hung out with "bad company." The crowd grumbled against Jesus, but it was their own presumptions and judgements against Zacchaeus that were called into question. Why do we, like the crowd, harbor such harsh judgements against others? The lesson of this Gospel story is clear. Oftentimes, we do not really know other people. Leave judgement to God, not to our own, often flawed, perceptions.


