From the Pastor's Desk...

The spiritual dimension of Advent can certainly get lost and drop from sight. The culture surrounding Christmas has become smothering and overwhelming, partly for reasons of appealing warmth and sparkle, partly due to the irresistible drive of commercialism and shopping. Added to that, I believe, is a pervasive sense of impatience among people in general, perfectly described by fast food, microwaves, instant messaging, and all forms of fast (yet friendly) delivery.

Advent really does not seem to stand a chance. A spiritual season that stresses waiting, watchfulness, and unrushed preparation cannot seem to compete. The latest victim in the mad dash to Christmas is Thanksgiving Day itself. Once reserved for a grand meal of thanks in the company of family, always preceded by televised parades, and followed by football and naps, has been swallowed up. Seasonal encroachment has been fully embraced by business interests, eager to rechristen the holiday in the name of shopping, terrific bargains, and the opening gun at the starting line (front door) of Walmart, Macy's and Target stores everywhere.

I come back to the lost spiritual voice of Advent. It is precisely this tidal wave-like rush and crush of a stampeding commercial season that the Gospel speaks to today. The coming day of the Lord is so transformative of all prevailing conditions that everyone and everything is caught off guard. People will be eating and drinking, shopping and traveling, celebrating and singing. We become totally absorbed in the goings-on around us. Then, suddenly, the Lord appears. It is His appearance we hope and pray for during the Advent Season. Will we be prepared or caught off guard? Advent has begun! We await the coming of our Savior.





Covid-19 Status for December 2022: You are asked to read and consider the following points as we head into the Advent and Christmas Season:

- Covid spread currently in Ohio is moderate to low.
 Infection remains a distant possibility for all of us, however.
- The third booster against the Omicron variant, the current virus, has been available for some time. Consider getting the vaccine, especially if you are elderly with any health conditions or simply wish to protect yourself and loved ones. Ages five and up are eligible.
- Masks remain optional while in Church. Please know you are welcome and encouraged to wear one. All our Eucharistic Ministers have been and will be wearing one for the distribution of Holy Communion.
- Spread may well increase because of the Thanksgiving holiday and contact with family members. The available medications, especially Plaxovid, are effective in suppressing the virus within five days of symptoms. (Fr. Arnold used Plaxovid in May/June and found it very effective.) Contact your doctor or pharmacy for details.

The Gospel of Matthew, Cycle A: The new Church calendar year begins with this season of Advent, reintroducing us to the Gospel according to Matthew.

Most are familiar with Matthew, the tax collector, who was a disciple of Jesus. While it remains possible that "this" Matthew could have been the author of this Gospel, Scripture scholars are not at all certain. What they do believe is that the author of this Gospel was most likely a Jewish convert to the Christian faith, and perhaps even a rabbi.

His familiarity with Jewish Scriptures is much in evidence. The author of this Gospel often quotes the prophets throughout his text, especially Isaiah. But he also references other Old Testament sources broadly, especially texts supporting the central theme of his Gospel: Jesus Christ is the one who fulfills and completes the Jewish longing for a new relationship of the people with their God.

Matthew's Gospel, however, also emphasizes the all-embracing, universalistic theme of Salvation which includes the Gentiles, just not the Jewish tribes of Israel. Matthew presents a Jewish Messiah, whose mission embraces "the others," the Gentiles. He presents a Gospel to be proclaimed and preached to all nations, a distinct departure from traditional Jewish thinking. In Matthew's infancy narrative, this is most clearly illustrated by the visit of the Magi, foreigners and Gentiles who come to give homage to the newborn "King of the Jews."






