#### From the Pastor's Desk...

The Gospel consistently calls each reader of its message to place faith and trust in God. The Gospel narrative offers, time and again, the example of strong yet simple reliance upon God and the overwhelming good which comes to those who place their future and cares in God's hands.

Consider the dilemma of the unassuming, simple man named Joseph. In the ordinary course of his life, he chooses a woman for his wife. Joseph's intention to marry her is jolted by some unexpected and bad news. His betrothed is pregnant with child. He knows the child cannot be his own. He is probably hurt and somewhat angered. At least that would be the normal, expected reaction. Confronted by this scandal, he could have publicly exposed his beloved, or behind the scene, quietly divorced her and broken the engagement.

Instead, Joseph decides to interpret this crisis through faith. He decides to listen to God directing his life through his messenger, who tells him, "Do not be afraid." Joseph embraces an invitation to place confidence in God and to act not out of fear and pride, but out of a response born of faith. Another more self-righteous and self-confident man might have moved to protect his own reputation first. Instead, he awakens from the sleep of self-doubt and decides to do as the Lord had commanded him.

When I was much younger, I remember my parents urging me, after cranky episodes or fits of whining, to get a good night's sleep. Afterward, they believed a clearer, more rested mind would guide my behavior. They were right, as it turned out. The Gospel for the Fourth Sunday of Advent offers us this, but far more. Joseph, in his sleep, decides to put aside personal doubt and potential shame and to embrace what God would have him do. God's grace, working in the human person, can accomplish miracles.



Feast of the Holy Family: Friday, December 30, 2022 – There will be one Mass that day at 9:00 a.m. at Holy Spirit. Many Catholics unfortunately take a pass

on attending Mass on this day. But as we come to the end the year, I want you to know what prayer intentions are connected to this feast:

- We pray for all families who work hard, raise their children, pay their bills, and struggle every day with the duties and troubles of daily life.
- We remember all families who are grieving this holiday season over the loss of a loved one and people close to them.
- We pray for families divided because of war or civil violence; families separated by immigration or deportation; families apart because of imprisonment; families separated by divorce, or families torn apart by domestic violence at home.
- We remember families separated because a loved one is serving in harm's way in the armed forces.
- We pray for all families whose parents are in nursing or care centers, especially elderly folks who are separated from their children who live great distances away.

Father, help us to love as the Holy Family, united in respect and love. Teach us the sanctity of human love, show us the value of family life, and help us to live in peace with all people that we may share in your life forever. We pray through Christ our Lord. Amen.

**56th Day of Prayer for World Peace:** Every Holy Father since Pope Paul VI in 1967 (that includes John Paul II, Pope Benedict, and Pope Francis) has called upon Catholics and peoples of the world to pray for peace. The Holy Father commands neither military

force nor an arsenal of weapons to "fight" for peace. Rather, Pope Francis uses the words of Jesus in Luke's Gospel.

In sending His disciples forth on mission, Jesus told them:

"Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace be to this house!' And if a son of peace is there, your peace shall rest upon him; but if not, it shall return to you."

Pope Francis has emphasized the role of good politics – more specifically – **good politicians**, as key to bringing peace to the world and society. Politicians should see themselves as the **servants of all**. These qualities the politicians of every (or any) nation ought to possess. They are called the "Beatitudes of the Politician."

- Blessed be the politician with a lofty sense and deep understanding of his role.
- Blessed be the politician who personally exemplifies credibility.
- Blessed be the politician who works for the common good and not his or her own interest.
- Blessed be the politician who remains consistent.
- Blessed be the politician who works for unity.
- Blessed be the politician who works to accomplish radical change.
- Blessed be the politician who is capable of listening.
- Blessed be the politician who is without fear.

One thing is certain: Good politics is at the service of peace. It respects and promotes fundamental human rights, which are at the same time mutual obligations, enabling a bond of trust and gratitude to be forged between present and future generations.




