From the Pastor's Desk...

A word of explanation is required perhaps to understand the celebration of the various feasts during this year's Christmas season. It may seem as though a couple of the regular feasts have been "dropped off or cut out." That is not the case. The change in emphasis this year has to do with the day of the week December 25th (Christmas) and January 1st (Feast of Mary, Mother of God) falls on.

Both of these Holy Days fell on a Sunday this year. Christmas is always a Holy Day of Obligation, regardless of what day of the week it lands on. This made for a full Advent Season – 4 Sundays plus four full weekdays of Advent. The feast of Mary, the Mother of God, is also always celebrated on January 1st, although unfortunately a great many people only observe New Year's Day as a civil or secular holiday, resulting in their not attending Mass. Because this feast falls on a Sunday, this year, many people will come to Church because it is on a Sunday.

What happened then to one feast (Holy Family) and what will happen to another (The Baptism of the Lord)? The Holy Family is normally celebrated on a Sunday between Christmas and January 1st. Simply stated, there is no Sunday this year between these two days. This year, the Holy Family was celebrated on Friday, December 30th. Next year, when January 1st falls on a Monday, we will celebrate the Holy Family on Sunday, December 31st.

The Baptism of the Lord, which will be observed on Monday, January 9, 2023, also usually falls on the Sunday after the observance of the Epiphany, or the feast of the Three Kings. This would create an extraordinarily long Christmas Season (were it to be placed on January 14th). There must be a minimum number of Sundays in Ordinary Time, so this places the Baptism on a Monday, January 9th, when it will be observed at Mass on that day.

Every year, I emphasize to Catholics that we religiously observe the Season of Christmas from the Vigil of Christmas (always December 24th) until the Baptism of Jesus (a movable date). So many people stop celebrating Christmas on January 1st, when the rest of society does. Observant Christians have always celebrated Christmas beyond January 1st. Could it be, that because the secular and commercial Christmas season now starts way before Thanksgiving Day, that so many people shortened its real historical and liturgical observance?

The Christmas Season: Christmas Day in contemporary American culture is observed as the end point of weeks of decorating, holiday festivities and, of course, shopping. Many commercial terms of our economic system were coined as they relate to the purchase of goods – "Black Friday" (after Thanksgiving) and "Cyber Monday," not to mention individual store "return policies" for gifts that didn't work, please, or fit.

Christmas Day – in the Church – marks the beginning of the Christmas Season. It begins with the Masses of the Christmas Vigil, includes the Feasts of the Holy Family, Mary, the Mother of God, and the Epiphany, and concludes with the Baptism of the Lord. With the exception of Christmas, and Mary, the Mother of God, all these feasts have movable dates on the calendar.

Our Church decorations – hopefully, those in our homes as well – reflect the Christmas season to the very end. This gulf between the pre-Christmas buildup and the actual celebrations of Christmas in our Church grows wider each year, due primarily to the earlier and earlier preparations for the commercial holiday giving season. Reflect, if you will, on what has actually happened over these last many years. When do we actually observe the "Christmas Season" in our faith life, or has that been swallowed up by the two-month long seasonal and commercial build-up?



Christmas Card Thank-You: I received numerous Christmas cards from parishioners of both St. Philip and Holy Spirit Parishes. They are not thrown in a pile. I take a moment and sit down




