From the Pastor's Desk...

The responsorial psalm for this weekend should be familiar to all of us: "Here I am, Lord, I come to do your will." You may have never thought of it this way, but God's offer to us of salvation is never "disembodied." That simply means that God always chooses to work through people. Think, if you will, of Mary: "I am the servant (handmaid) of the Lord; let it happen to me accordingly to your will."

God chooses, then calls, people to carry out His plan. In today's Gospel, John the Baptist clearly sees his role not as the Messiah, but as one who was to announce the Messiah's message, and then identify him when he should come. Many of John's listeners, and perhaps even a few of his own disciples, may have thought that he (John) was the Messiah.

John then identifies Jesus as the "Lamb of God." This name or symbolism is important in the Gospel of John, because Jesus is pointed out as the Paschal Lamb, the lamb of sacrifice in the Jewish Passover ritual. Early on in this Gospel, Jesus is to be known as the one who serves others and is to be sacrificed for others. This was the call – the mission – of Jesus. He is the Servant of God, who came to do the will of the Father. He identifies himself through the weakness of a lamb to be sacrificed, not as a mighty warrior and Messiah. This certainly was not the image of a "Messiah" or "Savior" that many of Jesus' contemporaries were expecting...or hoping for.

Shared Parish Information

Both parish offices will be closed on Monday, January 16th, for Martin Luther King, Jr. Day. The offices will reopen on Tuesday, January 17, 2023.



What is Ordinary Time? On Monday we celebrated the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. After that Feast, the Church returns to Ordinary Time. This period will extend until Tuesday, February 21st, the day before Ash Wednesday. It will begin again on Monday, May 29th, the day after the celebration of Pentecost, and extend all the way until the Saturday before the first Sunday of Advent, Saturday, December 2, 2023.

Keep in mind that every Sunday is intended to be a “little Easter.” Sunday, the first day of the week, witnessed Jesus Christ rising from the dead. Our weekly Church liturgy centers around this central mystery of belief of Christian faith – the Resurrection.

The great liturgical seasons of Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter are expansive celebrations of the Church’s belief in Jesus Christ, the Incarnate Son of God, who in the great act of redemption became flesh, was crucified, and rose from the dead. These two seasons are given added emphasis since they recall the central events of Salvation History.

But no Sunday is “ordinary.” It is the day of the Lord, at the same time the goal of every week and the beginning of the next. Sundays are the “fabric” of Christian living – we offer our thanks to God in the celebration of the Eucharist. We hear the Gospel proclaimed and are fed with the Bread of Life, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ himself.

Let’s just say this: Ordinary Time refers to the prayers and worship of the Church outside of the Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter celebrations. The color used for the Sunday Mass is green, as well as for weekdays whose liturgy celebrates no particular saint or feast.

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.: On Monday, we honor the memory of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. He was only 39 years old when he was killed by a gunman in Memphis, Tennessee on April 4, 1968. To those of us who were alive at that time, it seems like such a long time ago.

How can we honor his memory? Dr. King believed in nonviolence to bring about change. He had his opponents and even enemies who opposed his proposals for change in American society. But he believed that to use violence was evil. An eye for an eye approach, he believed, would eventually leave all of us blind.

Violence is senseless. It continues to destroy people and leaves deep scars. We look to the example of Jesus Christ in the Gospel. He said we should not return injury for harm, we need to understand that in spite of differences, we are in this together. That was the belief and faith of Dr. King.
