From the Pastor's Desk...

Consider how a “fan base” for a singer, a band, or a Hollywood star grows. It is people themselves, the fans, who are attracted to a specific personality and start following the star, collecting music, sending fan mail, and generally going crazy when the star appears in concert or on television. It is no different with sports figures or politicians. Our society fosters a “cult of personality” around so many people in the public spotlight.

We should all be familiar with the scene from today's Gospel. Perhaps it is too familiar, and we overlook what actually takes place. It is quite the exact opposite of the growth of a “fan base” described above. It is Jesus Himself who calls and selects, and the response of each individual called by Jesus is not based on the popularity or good looks of Jesus. Each individual called is required to change. They respond to Jesus not by seeking an autograph or screaming and shouting. They respond by a changed life.

Let's not overlook how great a contrast the call of Jesus actually presents, compared to popular public figures with a following today. The disciples Jesus chose were invited to change and give a whole different meaning to their lives. They were called to leave their old profession and themselves behind. They were to become “fishers of men” – to win people over to the message of the Gospel.

One of the personal challenges each individual Christian experiences in life is to figure out what they believe they are being “called” to do. There may be a more “secular” consideration, for example, on whether to be a teacher, a doctor, or an accountant. The call of Jesus to be a disciple, however, is not necessarily about the desired salary or the proper suitability of talents. The call to discipleship calls for a total commitment of the individual – an inner transformation – to follow the call of the Gospel. To be a disciple of Jesus means to leave one's self behind, whether one is a mother or a homemaker, a lawyer or a construction worker, a dad or a retired grandparent.

Third Week in Ordinary Time

Almighty ever-living God, direct our actions according to Your good pleasure, that in the name of Your beloved Son we may abound in good works. Through Our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.



What is Ordinary Time? After we celebrated the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, the Church returned to Ordinary Time. This period will extend until Tuesday, February 21st, the day before Ash Wednesday. It will begin again on Monday,

May 29th, the day after the celebration of Pentecost, and extend all the way until the Saturday before the first Sunday of Advent, Saturday, December 2, 2023.

Keep in mind that every Sunday is intended to be a “little Easter.” Sunday, the first day of the week, witnessed Jesus Christ rising from the dead. Our weekly Church liturgy centers around this central mystery and belief of the Christian faith – the Resurrection.

The great liturgical seasons of Advent-Christmas and Lent-Easter are expansive celebrations of the Church’s belief in Jesus Christ, the Incarnate Son of God, who in the great act of redemption became flesh, was crucified, and rose from the dead. These two seasons are given added emphasis since they recall the central events of Salvation History.

But no Sunday is “ordinary.” It is the day of the Lord, at the same time the goal of every week and the beginning of the next. Sundays are the “fabric” of Christian living – we offer our thanks to God in the celebration of the Eucharist. We hear the Gospel proclaimed and are fed with the Bread of Life, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ Himself.

Let’s just say this: Ordinary Time refers to the prayers and worship of the Church outside of the Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter celebrations. The color used for the Sunday Mass is green, as well as for weekdays whose liturgy celebrates no particular saint or feast.

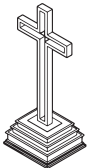
