



From the Pastor's Desk...

What exactly are the Beatitudes? How can they be described or understood? They are certainly part of the teaching of Jesus. In today's Gospel, taken from the part of Matthew's Gospel better known as the "Sermon on the Mount," the evangelist perfectly frames the setting. He describes Jesus up on the mount (compare to Moses' receiving the Law on Mt. Sinai); sitting down to teach (as did the teachers of the Law giving instruction); and finally, Jesus giving the meaning of the New Law (as compared to the Old Law of Sinai).

The Beatitudes are promises of hope to those who embrace discipleship. They represent promises that God has made to humanity. Some of these promises are fulfilled every day as we live: mourners are comforted and, the poor in spirit (those who rely only on God) live among us, demonstrating trust and confidence in God in all they do. These were signs to Matthew that the kingdom of God, announced by Jesus, was already alive and living among those embracing the Good News of the Gospel.

The Beatitudes are also promises of things yet to come. The listeners of Jesus' day were craving encouragement and hope, as are so many people in the world today. Life has always been difficult, and those embracing the Gospel were experiencing rejection and exclusion from their own communities. They are instructed to lift up their vision and hearts, so as to understand that God is in charge of all time and history. God's coming kingdom, mentioned in every utterance of the "Our Father," is a kingdom in which God fulfills the longings of the poor, the weak, the mourning and those hungering for justice and peace.

The Beatitudes also describe Christian virtues. which those who long for God's kingdom are encouraged to embrace. The Christian believer is encouraged to become meek, embracing humility, to work untiringly for peace, to thirst for justice. Virtue is a quality of the heart that shapes character and the actions of our lives. We believe the Saints are with God precisely because they made the Beatitudes the reason for their hope and relied on God alone. Every time we hear the Beatitudes, we are invited to become citizens of the Kingdom, working together in the Church, to make God's kingdom alive in our day!


