# From the Pastor's Desk...

Christmas carols have now stopped playing on the radio, and very soon (if not already on December 26!), discarded Christmas trees lay with the garbage cans, waiting to be recycled. It is amazing how quickly the Christmas season ends for so many people. We are quite aware that for many people (especially for the merchants), the season began early in November, if not last July!

The Church continues the Christmas celebration, however. It is a religious season, not merely a commercial or party season leading up to December 25th. If more people understood the true meaning of the next appearance of the Lord – the Epiphany to the Magi – logically, their observance of the season would continue. Perhaps the reason for the rapid disappearance of Christmas Spirit lies in its strong ties in our culture to consumption and seasonal exhaustion. After all, the pocketbook and body can take only so much.

The Magi do not believe in the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. They were Gentiles, not Jews. Yet, the story of their visit to Bethlehem finds them embracing faith and belief far surpassing that of the Jewish court of Herod. He is disturbed at the news of a rival to his power. According to the story, all Jerusalem was greatly disturbed with him. What does this tell us?

The good news of a Savior's birth is not news embraced by everyone on the same level or in the same way. The Gospel story of Matthew describes Jesus not as a rival political power to Herod, but a threat to those content with what they have and who they are. The Gospel is to be proclaimed to everyone. Salvation is for everyone, even the forgotten, the powerless, and the unbeliever. The Good News, however, must be made visible in lives of individuals beyond the shopping season or the calendar of parties and celebrations. How long did all of you celebrate Christmas?

Celebrations of Christmas: During the Christmas Season, the Church celebrates three major "appearances," "revelations," or "epiphanies" of Jesus Christ. Each represents a revelation of God's plan in

time and history. Each carries a distinct character and purpose, and influences our own celebration of Christmas, especially in duration. Unfortunately, our religious observance of the Christmas season has long ago been overwhelmed by secular forces, primarily the commercial nature of the season. Consider the following:

- Christmas Day marks the beginning of our salvation. We celebrate the Incarnation, the taking on of human flesh by God. The birth of Emmanuel, "God With Us," signals the beginning of a new relationship between God and all humanity God as one of us.
- The Epiphany (or the Visit of the Magi) is a special revelation of God in a human body to exotic visitors from a foreign land. The appearance of the "God became Man" is for the salvation of all humanity, Gentile and Jew alike.
- The Baptism of Jesus (celebrated Monday, January 9th) is the revelation by Water, Spirit, and eventually by Fire of the "beloved Son" of the Father. The identity of the Son is confirmed by the Voice of the Father, and through the ritual repentance by the water of Baptism.

**The New Year – 2023:** So many of us are glad, for a variety of reasons, that 2022 is behind us. With elections, inflation, bad weather – well, some things come around again all the time.



But, let's not forget that we Christians are optimistic about the future. Avoid listening to predictions of doom and apocalyptic destruction. Some people are hoping for such a disaster and even welcome it.

We believe God is in charge of all time and history. Previous generations have experienced overwhelming crises and prevailed. So shall we. Do not be afraid, the Gospels tell us. Truer today than in Biblical times. God is with us and God loves this world. Happy New Year 2023!






