From the Pastor's Desk...

Lent calls upon all Christians to turn away from sin and to repent of the wrong they have done. The three disciplines of Lent – prayer, fasting (self-denial), and almsgiving (sharing with those in need) are seen as penance. Penance is more than an apology or seeking forgiveness. Penance is an attempt to make up for the wrong we have done.

On this First Sunday of Lent, I would ask you to focus your attention on two approaches to sharing with those in need. I think most of us with good intention want to share with those in need - at Thanksgiving, Christmas, Lent or whenever. But what we give away can come from two sources, from our surplus (the extra we have above and beyond our own needs) or from our substance (we part with something we ourselves actually need or would like to have).

Sharing from our surplus goods or funds really makes sense, even if some people won't even do that. The extra canned goods, the extra coat or used clothing, the extra few dollars in our pocket are excess beyond our needs. It is very easy to part with our surplus because, although it is an act of generosity, such giving causes us little discomfort. Of course, there is merit in sharing whatever "extra" we might have.

But a deeper, more meaningful and "more painful" generosity involves giving from our substance. To give away what I myself truly need fulfills the definition of sacrifice. I freely give up possession or enjoyment of anything in order to afford someone else the enjoyment of a new coat, new shoes, and a good order of groceries. And, I do without. All of us have had relatives or a good friend who has set that example for us. They did without something so that we might have it. This kind of almsgiving hurts a little more and has, I believe, greater value for the one who gives.

Ask yourself which of the two forms of giving – from surplus or substance - you actually practice. I would suggest that giving away what we ourselves truly need or want leads us to fully experience the meaning of sacrifice. It is in a true sense "self-denial." Reflect on the depth of your charitable giving. Decide if - for this Lent and beyond - you want to more fully experience what helping another can mean.



First Week of Lent (Collect or Opening Prayer for Mass)

Grant, almighty God,

through the yearly observances of holy Lent, that we may grow in understanding of the riches hidden in Christ and by worthy conduct pursue their effects. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.



The Liturgy of Lent. The season of Lent brings changes to the celebration of the Mass on Sundays and weekdays. These changes reflect the somber and penitential nature of the Lenten Season, as we prepare for the upcoming celebration of the Passion and Death of our Lord Jesus Christ. Notice if you will, when you attend Mass, that

- The color of Lent is violet/purple. No flowers and other sanctuary décor is present.
- The hymns of Lent are shorter, simple and terse. The music is not triumphant or celebratory.
- The Gloria and Alleluia are dropped, and do not reappear until Holy Thursday, Mass of the Lord's Supper.
- The final hymn, the Recessional, may be dropped altogether and simple recessional music played.



Penance Service, Next Sunday, March 5, 2023: The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a visible sign of the forgiveness of God. Our first parish penance service for Lent and the opportunity to receive the Sacrament will be next Sunday,

March 5, 2023, at 4:00 p.m., at Holy Spirit Parish. The second graders of Holy Spirit School and PSR will make their First Penance that day. There will be several priests present to hear individual Confessions after a brief common prayer service and examination of conscience. The hearing of private Confessions will move along quickly. Join them in receiving this sacrament before Lent.

Special Lenten Almsgiving: Again this year, both St. Philip and Holy Spirit Parishes are going to assist the Piarist Fathers in Eastern Kentucky with their outreach needs for the poor of that area. There are few jobs and few Catholics where Fr. Tom Carroll works. (He was our mission speaker in 2018.) The needs there are great, and this will help the Piarist Fathers to assist folks in the local area. This Special Collection will take place at the weekend Masses of Lent.

Lenten Study Series: Seven Deadly Sins, Seven Lively Virtues

For our 2023 Lenten Study, we will be watching Bishop Robert Barron's presentations on the seven deadly sins, those great spiritual blocks that inhibit our flourishing in relationship with God and one another. Based on Dante's writings, the seven deadly sins correspond to the

seven stories of Dante's Mt. Purgatory. Pride, envy, anger, sloth, gluttony, avarice and lust are all presented as patterns of dysfunction within us that lead to unhappiness. Bishop Barron shows us how to counteract these seven sinful patterns through a conscious process of opposition, known as the "seven lively virtues." These offer antidotes to each sin and help set us on the right path to healing and happiness. We will be watching two short presentations each Sunday in Lent followed by a group discussion. 


