From the Pastor's Desk...

Lent can teach us many lessons about ourselves, if we commit ourselves to experience these forty days. Self-denial can direct us away from yearning for all the things we do not have. Wants have a funny way of turning themselves into must-have needs. While there are things we lack materially, emotionally, and spiritually, it becomes difficult to distinguish between the category of wanting and the necessity of needing something.

In the first reading of the Third Sunday of Lent, the Israelites wandering through the desert wilderness needed water. Their grumbling against God and Moses turned, however, into desperation, which then eroded their trust in God, who had led them out of Pharaoh's slavery. Their growing dissatisfaction led in turn to their forgetting all that God had done for them. They questioned God's reliability and faithfulness to them.

What did the woman at the well really need in today's Gospel? She came to the well for water to drink. But after her conversation with Jesus, who allowed Himself to converse publicly with a known sinner and a Samaritan Gentile, she came to know what she really needed. She needed release from the isolation, disapproval, and stigma of her sins which no one had provided her. She needed a fresh start and forgiveness which Jesus provided. Lent can teach us a great many things about ourselves. Perhaps our self-denial of all our many wants can teach us something about our genuine needs.

Third Week of Lent (Collect or Opening Prayer for Mass)

O God, author of every mercy and of all goodness, who in fasting, prayer and almsgiving have shown us a remedy for sin, look graciously on this confession of our lowliness, that we, who are bowed down by our conscience, may always be lifted up by Your mercy. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son,

who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

The Stations of the Cross is a narration of the final hours of Jesus' life here on earth. The Stations of the Cross will be prayed at St. Philip Church on the following Friday afternoons:

Friday, March 17 – 2:00 p.m. Friday, March 24 – 2:00 p.m. Friday, March 31 – 2:00 p.m.

Stations will be prayed at Holy Spirit on the following Wednesday afternoons with the students of Holy Spirit School:

Wednesday, March 22nd – 1:30 p.m. Wednesday, March 29th – 1:30 p.m.



Dispensation for Saint Patrick's Day: The obligation to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent is an important element of the Church's observance of the penitential nature of this holy season. This year, March 17th corresponds with St. Patrick's

Day, traditionally an occasion for joy-filled celebrations, especially among those of Irish heritage. Bishop Fernandes, taking into consideration both past practice and present circumstances, has granted to the faithful of the Diocese of Columbus a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence from meat on March 17, 2023, provided that the member of the faithful taking advantage of this dispensation, undertakes one of the following works: 1) makes a pilgrimage or visit to any church in the Diocese of Columbus named in honor of St. Patrick (Columbus, London, Junction City); 2) assists at Mass at any church, chapel, or oratory on March 17th; 3) prays the "Breastplate of St. Patrick," attributed to St. Patrick; 4) engages in some pious devotion such as the Rosary, the Stations of the Cross, or Eucharistic Adoration; or 5) performs an act of comparable penance (such as abstinence from meat) on some other occasion during the Third Week of Lent.



Lenten Study Series: Seven Deadly Sins, Seven Lively Virtues - For our 2023 Lenten Study, we will be watching Bishop Robert Barron's presentations on the seven deadly sins, those great spiritual blocks that inhibit our flourishing in relationship with God and one another. Based on Dante's writings, the seven deadly sins correspond to the seven

stories of Dante's Mt. Purgatory. Pride, envy, anger, sloth, gluttony, avarice and lust are all presented as patterns of dysfunction within us that lead to unhappiness. Bishop Barron shows us how to counteract these seven sinful patterns through a conscious process of opposition, known as the "seven lively virtues." These offer antidotes to each sin and help set us on the right path to healing and happiness. We will be watching two short presentations each Sunday in Lent followed by a group discussion. We will be meeting from 6:00-7:30 p.m. in the parish conference room on the following dates. A light supper will be provided. Please call 614-861-1521 to sign up.

Special Mass – Feast of St. Joseph: In an apostolic letter published in 2020, "Patris Corde" (with a father's heart), Pope Francis said Christians can discover in St. Joseph, who often goes unnoticed, "an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of

trouble."

As Mary's husband and guardian of the Son of God, St. Joseph turned "his human vocation to domestic love into a superhuman oblation (offering) of himself, his heart and all his abilities, a love placed at the service of the Messiah who was growing to maturity in his home."

At Holy Spirit, the Feast of St. Joseph will be marked with Mass on Monday, March 20, 2023, followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and praying of the Rosary. Please come and spend some time in prayer.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick: At the 4 o'clock Mass at St. Philip on Saturday, March 25, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated.

This Sacrament is intended for all who are facing a chronic health problem; those who face surgery soon or are recovering from surgery; those who are infirmed through advancing age.

Those who are to receive the Sacrament should receive a name tag before the beginning of Mass. Those who will be anointed will sit every other row at the front of the Church, so that the priests may come to these individuals, without anyone standing in a long line. The Dominican Sisters of Peace will assist those preparing to receive the Sacrament.



Volunteers Needed – Foot Washing on Holy Thursday: The Mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated on Thursday, April 6, 2023 at 7:00 p.m. Each year, parishioners are asked

to participate in a sacred and wonderful ceremony – the Mandatum – or command of Jesus to wash the feet of the disciples of God as Jesus Himself did at the Last Supper. Arnold, to lead this ceremony in our parish. He will be retiring on December 1st of this year.

Special Lenten Almsgiving: Again this year, both St. Philip and Holy Spirit Parishes are going to assist the Piarist Fathers in Eastern Kentucky with their outreach needs for the poor of that area. There are few jobs and few Catholics, where Fr. Tom Carroll works. (He was our mission speaker in 2018.) The needs there are great, and this will help the Piarist Fathers to assist folks in the local area. This Special Collection will take place at the weekend Masses of Lent.




