#### From the Pastor's Desk...

There is no such thing as a good disability. It is an inane question to pose, which disability causes the greatest limitations or difficulties for the person so weighed down by one. Physical blindness, however, represents only one aspect of the darkness some people live in. In the Gospel, Jesus healed the blind on several different occasions. There is always reference, however, to blindness which kills the spirit and compassion of people. Many more people suffer some form of spiritual blindness than would admit.

Which is worse, to be blind to the panorama of light and color that is the physical world, or to be blind to one's own failings and the misery of others? Does the greater disability lie in feeling or tapping one's way through the world, or displaying bold indifference to the pain and injustice found all around us? Is it a greater personal evil to be unable to see the lights go on at night in the city or to fail to see the suffering caused by war, poverty, or sickness as something we are called to act upon?

Lent calls us to make a personal journey out of the darkness that engulfs our lives, to live everyday with eyes wide open. In today's Gospel, Jesus rejected the popular notion that any physical disability comes as the result of personal sin. But it is personal sin which blinds us to our faults, our real needs, and the genuine needs of others. During Lent, we call upon God to heal our personal blindness, even if we possess 20-20 vision. During Lent, we want to learn anew how to walk as sons and daughters of light. It is the only way we can find the difficult way through this world back to God.

### Fourth Week of Lent (Collect or Opening Prayer for Mass)

O God, who through Your Word reconcile the human race to Yourself in a wonderful way, grant, we pray, that with prompt devotion and eager faith the Christian people may hasten toward the solemn celebrations to come. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

**Special Mass – Feast of St. Joseph:** In an apostolic letter published in 2020, "Patris Corde" (with a father's heart), Pope Francis said "Christians can discover in St. Joseph, who often goes unnoticed, an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble."

As Mary's husband and guardian of the son of God, St. Joseph turned "his human vocation to domestic love into a superhuman oblation (offering) of himself, his heart and all his abilities, a love placed at the service of the Messiah who was growing to maturity in his home."

At Holy Spirit, the Feast of St. Joseph will be marked with Mass on Monday, March 20, 2023, followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and praying of the Rosary. Please come and spend some time in prayer.

Lenten Study Series: Seven Deadly Sins, Seven Lively Virtues – For our 2023 Lenten Study, we will be watching Bishop Robert Barron's presentations on the seven deadly sins, those great spiritual blocks that inhibit our flourishing in relationship with God and one another. Based on Dante's writings, the seven deadly sins

correspond to the seven stories of Dante's Mt. Purgatory. Pride, envy, anger, sloth, gluttony, avarice and lust are all presented as patterns of dysfunction within us that lead to unhappiness. Bishop Barron shows us how to counteract these seven sinful patterns through a conscious process of opposition, known as the "seven lively virtues." These offer antidotes to each sin and help set us on the right path to healing and happiness. We will be watching two short presentations each Sunday in Lent followed by a group discussion. "Cradle of the Faith: The Forlorn Sheep": The roots of the Catholic faith in Ohio began with the persistent requests for a priest to administer the sacraments to Catholics living in the wilderness near Somerset, Ohio. Archbishop John Carroll, S.J., of Baltimore, answered those requests by sending Fr. Edward Fenwick, O.P., who offered the first Mass in a log cabin in 1808, and who dedicated St. Joseph Church, Ohio's first Catholic church at Somerset in December 1818. Peter Thomas is the caretaker of the First Mass Memorial site and William Noll is the principal and administrator of Holy Trinity schools in Somerset. They will jointly present the story of how the Catholic faith took root in Ohio. The presentation will occur at the Catholic Foundation, 257 East Broad Street in Columbus on Sunday, March 26, 2023. 


