From the Pastor's Desk...

Where is the risen Jesus Christ? Where is Christ in our own personal lives when we need the assurance of His presence? Where is the presence of Christ in today's world, which could sorely use a divine healer, comforter, and mediator? This question is posed by faithful, believing people today, who could truly use a source of strength and reassurance.

The theme of Jesus' apparent absence appears twice in today's Gospel when both Mary and Martha needed Jesus. Their brother, Lazarus, was sick and eventually died. The critics of Jesus in the Gospel are also quick with a remark: "Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?"

Faith in the risen Christ challenges us to realize that even though Jesus did not rush to Martha and Mary's side, Jesus calls Lazarus from the tomb, even though the stench of death permeates the opened tomb. This is the faith we are called to have in the Church today. We fear death, naturally, because we fear what we do not know and cannot control. It is, however, the faith of the Christian to believe – even in a world filled and colored by death in so many ways – that the dead are "asleep" as was Lazarus. We wait for the Resurrection, the ultimate event of our lives, when we too – like Christ – will be transformed in glory.

Continue in your Lenten practices!

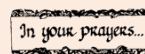

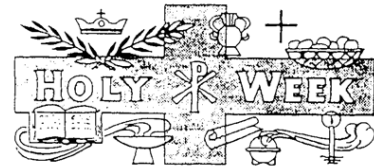

If you cannot attend/share supper with everyone, you are, of course, invited and urged to celebrate the beginning of the Sacred Triduum at the Holy Thursday Mass, which begins at 7:00 p.m. This is a wonderful way to begin the observance of the holiest days of the Catholic calendar.

There will be no Mass at St. Philip on Thursday, April 6th or Saturday, April 8th. These Masses for Holy Week will be celebrated jointly with the parishioners of Holy Spirit Parish at Holy Spirit Church.



Rice Bowls – Bring to Holy Thursday Mass: If you have adopted the Lenten Practice of filling a Rice Bowl as a sign of sacrifice and self-denial for the poor and hungry of the world, bring your Rice Bowl to the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening. Good Friday Holy Land Collection: Pope Francis has asked us to support the Pontifical Good Friday Collection, which helps Christians in the Holy Land. The wars, unrest and instability have been especially hard on

This is the Last Week for Special Lenten Almsgiving: Again this year, both St. Philip and Holy Spirit Parishes are going to assist the Piarist Fathers in Eastern Kentucky with their outreach needs for the poor of that area. 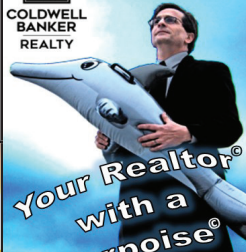

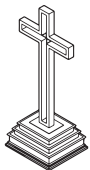
