From the Pastor's Desk...

Each year, the Gospel of the Second Sunday of Lent presents the narrative of Jesus taking the three disciples high on the mountaintop. The symbolism here in this image is strong – mountaintops were considered by the ancient peoples to be the meeting place between God and humanity. Important events took place on mountaintops – the giving of the Law of Moses, and Jesus' giving the New Law (Sermon on the Mount). Today, Jesus is transfigured into the glorious image of His future risen self. Peter, James, and John are awestruck – and they want Jesus to remain just as they see Him.

The lesson of Lent, however, is also the lesson Jesus gives His three disciples in this vision of His risen self. There can be no resurrection without the experience of life and suffering; there can be no transfiguration unless the crosses of life are carried. There can be no change—no transformation—without the patient endurance of faithful discipleship. Jesus tells His disciples, "Tell no one of this vision until the Son of Man is risen from the dead." He also gently, but firmly, tells them, "Do not be afraid."

So it is with our Lenten journey. We must pray, as did Jesus, and we must learn to deny the importance of self (fasting, sacrifice, almsgiving), as Jesus also did. The experience and the journey of Lent can change and transform us internally into the image of what we one day shall be. But just as Good Friday precedes the celebration and joy of Easter, lives of faithful discipleship (and our own death) come before our own sharing in Jesus' transfiguration and resurrection.

- Candidates must be at least 18 years old and have a high school diploma with a passion for working with young learners.



The Liturgy of Lent. The season of Lent brings changes to the celebration of the Mass on Sundays and weekdays. These changes reflect the somber and penitential nature of the Lenten Season, as we prepare for the upcoming celebration of the Passion and Death of our Lord Jesus Christ. Notice if you will, when you attend Mass, that

- The color of Lent is violet/purple. No flowers and other sanctuary décor is present.
- The hymns of Lent are shorter, simple and terse. The music is not triumphant or celebratory.
- **The Gloria and Alleluia** are dropped, and do not reappear until Holy Thursday, Mass of the Lord's Supper.
- The final hymn, the Recessional, may be dropped altogether and simple recessional music played.

Thank you J.O.I.N. Collection Thank You: The parishioners of St. Philip and Holy Spirit, and the students of Holy Spirit School, responded generously to the Ash Wednesday collection for the J.O.I.N. office downtown. Lenten Study Series: Seven Deadly Sins, **Seven Lively Virtues**

For our 2023 Lenten Study, we will be watching Bishop Robert Barron's presentations on the seven deadly sins, those great spiritual blocks that inhibit our flourishing in relationship with God and one another. Based on Dante's writings, the seven deadly sins correspond to the

seven stories of Dante's Mt. Purgatory. Pride, envy, anger, sloth, gluttony, avarice and lust are all presented as patterns of dysfunction within us that lead to unhappiness. Bishop Barron shows us how to counteract these seven sinful patterns through a conscious process of opposition, known as the "seven lively virtues." These offer antidotes to each sin and help set us on the right path to healing and happiness. We will be watching two short presentations each Sunday in Lent followed by a group discussion. 




