From the Pastor's Desk...

Holy Week is an important time of remembrance. The memories of Holy Week are those which remind us of the central truths of Catholic Faith that Jesus Christ died out of love for us. His suffering and death were the necessary prelude to his victory over the grave in his Resurrection on Easter Sunday. The memories of Holy Week give purpose to Christian faith and Christian living. Faith moves us every day to take up our cross and follow Him.

When we listen to the proclamation of the Passion Story on Palm Sunday and Good Friday, we are reminded of many things. We remember the great crowds which welcomed Jesus to the Passover feast. We remember that Jesus taught us to be servants to one another, as He washed the feet of his disciples on Holy Thursday. We remember when, on Good Friday, the angry crowds called for his death before Pilate. We remember that He forgave his persecutors and executioners as He hung upon the cross. We remember that he forgave the “good thief” hanging next to him on Calvary. We remember that Judas did not believe in the forgiveness demonstrated by Jesus, or, at least, he could not ask for it.

Holy Week, in its Scripture readings and ceremonies, challenges us to take up the cross and follow Jesus to Calvary. Please come and participate in the celebration of these great beliefs of Christian Faith, as we hear the stories retold of Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, and Good Friday. The celebration of Easter will have greater meaning for us, because next Sunday, we gather to proclaim the central belief of Christian faith: Christ is risen from the dead, and our lives are changed by the power of divine love and Christ's victory over death.

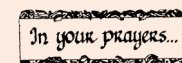

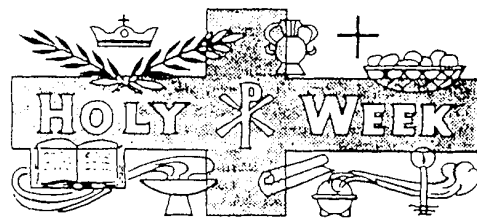

Shared Parish Information

There will be no Mass at St. Philip on Thursday, April 6th or Saturday, April 8th. These Masses for Holy Week will be celebrated jointly with the parishioners of Holy Spirit Parish at Holy Spirit Church.

Palm Sunday (Collect or Opening Prayer for Mass)

Almighty ever-living God,
who as an example of humility
for the human race to follow
caused our Savior to take flesh and submit
to the Cross, graciously grant that we may
heed His lesson of patient suffering
and so merit a share in His Resurrection.
Who lives and reigns with You in the unity
of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.



Holy Week is the most sacred week on the Christian calendar, and Catholics in particular hold the Sacred Triduum (TRID-OO-um), Latin for “three days” as commemoration of Christ’s redemptive passage through death, burial and Resurrection to new life. The Church observes the Triduum as a single event made up of three distinctive parts. In accordance with the custom in Biblical times, each “day” begins in the evening.

Next Sunday begins the fifty-day celebration of the Easter Season. The importance of the Resurrection is reflected in the length of the season. The Paschal Mystery is celebrated for seven Sundays, ending with the celebration of the Ascension of the Lord and Pentecost, the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles.

Holy Week reminds us, however, that if we would rise with Him, we must first die with Him. Please come to the celebrations of the three Sacred Days as a sign of your commitment to the Catholic Community of St. Philip and Holy Spirit Parishes. Below is the list of liturgical events which will take place in our parishes this coming Holy Week:



Palm Sunday: Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey, and to the lavish praise of the townspeople who threw clothes, or possibly palms or small branches, in front of him as a sign of homage. Palm branches are a widely recognized symbol of peace and victory. Palms distributed each year on Palm Sunday are a sacramental, an item blessed by the Church for the spiritual benefit of the faithful. Many people will fashion them into small crosses or other items of personal devotion. They serve as a sacred reminder of the Lord’s entry into Jerusalem and his coming death on Good Friday.



Because the palms are blessed, they may not be discarded as trash. Instead, they are appropriately gathered at church and incinerated to create the ashes that will be used in the following year’s Ash Wednesday observance. Burning the palms in your fireplace, or digging a small hole in the ground and burning them, or cutting the palms into small pieces and burying them in the ground, are also good options. In any case, do not throw them out with the household trash or garbage destined for the landfill.

Holy Thursday, April 6th, all parishioners from both parishes are invited to share a meal together at 5:30 p.m. in the Parish Hall. There is no cost for the meal, but **reservations are required no later than April 3, 2023**. We will celebrate the Mass of the Lord’s Supper in church at 7:00 p.m. At Mass we commemorate the washing of the feet and the commitment to priestly service. After Mass, there is the procession to the Repository and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until midnight in the church.



Good Friday, April 7th, at 2:00 p.m. at St. Philip and 7:00 p.m. at Holy Spirit is the solemn Celebration of the Death of Our Lord Jesus Christ. The Passion according to John is proclaimed, the Holy Cross is venerated, and Holy Communion is distributed.

Holy Saturday, April 8th, at 8:30 p.m. at Holy Spirit, we will celebrate the Easter Vigil, preceded by the beautiful, once-a-year ceremony, of the Easter Night: The blessing of the New Fire, the lighting of the Easter Candle, Scripture readings narrating Salvation History, the Baptism of new members into the Church, and celebration of the first Eucharist of the Easter Season.

April 4, 2023: An Important, Sad Anniversary. On Tuesday, April 4th, we mark 55 years since the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in Memphis, Tennessee. He had gone there to support striking city garbage workers, who were seeking a just wage settlement.

Dr. King was only 39 years old, when he was murdered by a gunman on the balcony of the Lorraine Motel. He was a disciple of nonviolence in his efforts to secure equal rights and justice for all American citizens, as guaranteed by the U.S. Constitution.

We too, today in 2023, must as Christians advocate non-violence to solve the many problems we confront today. Violence only does harm to another person. Dr. King gave his life to promote the cause of nonviolence. The problem of violence still haunts our American society today. The law of absolute love in the Gospel forbids the use of violence to harm others.

Rice Bowls – Bring to Holy Thursday Mass: If you have adopted the Lenten Practice of filling a Rice Bowl as a sign of sacrifice and self-denial for the poor and hungry of the world, bring your Rice Bowl to the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening. There will be no regular Mass collection that evening. Baskets will be placed at the back of the Church to accept the Rice Bowls and then brought forward at offertory. The Rice bowls for St. Philip and Holy Spirit will be counted together.



Good Friday Holy Land Collection:

Pope Francis has asked us to support the Pontifical Good Friday Collection, which helps Christians in the Holy Land. The wars, unrest and instability have been especially hard on Christians, and this collection provides humanitarian aid to refugees. If you gave nothing in the past, consider making some type of gift. If you gave a dollar last year, think of giving two. If you gave five dollars, why not make it seven or ten or even more? If you won't be at the Good Friday service, put your gift in an envelope marked "*Good Friday Collection*" and drop it in the Sunday collection. Please be generous!



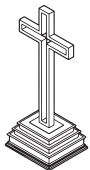
