From the Pastor's Desk...



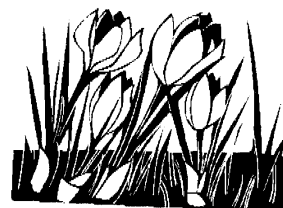
Embracing a new way of life and leaving behind old patterns of behavior are very difficult to do, to say the least. Consider a person struggling to give up an addiction, like a recovering alcoholic who needs to attend AA meetings for reinforcement and support. The same could be said for a person with a gambling addiction, or individuals we watch on TV who hoard and collect all kinds of things in their homes. These behavior patterns are difficult to change, nearly impossible to eliminate entirely.

A “successful” observance of Lent can be measured not in forever giving up chocolate or pizza and beer, but in how completely we give up on gossip, losing our temper, our greed, our unwillingness to forgive others. During the Easter Season, we celebrate the “new life” Jesus Christ has won for us by His Resurrection. “New life” means we rejected the old ways of life and have become a “new creation” in a faith and belief, and in living out the everyday actions of our hectic days.

The character flaws we have ingrained in our personalities can be overwhelming, and can hurt us and others in so many ways. But our greatest character trait – our fear of death and loss, can paralyze us and manipulate us. Thomas normally trusted the statements of his fellow disciples, but not their witness to seeing the crucified Lord, living and present to them, wishing them peace and courage. That he could not accept, so great was his sense of loss and grief over the death of his Lord.

Look at your world. It does not offer much support or reinforcement for acts of forgiveness, generosity, or even acceptance of people with all their flaws. Our “old selves” are comfortable with resentments over past hurts, selfishness, and intolerance. In the Death and Resurrection of the Lord, we can become new men and women. We can live without all those petty behaviors; we can live the new life Jesus Christ invited us to share!

Jesus Christ is Risen! **Happy Easter Season!**



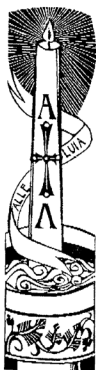

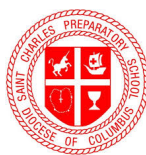
Congrats!

Earth Day, April 22, 2023: In *Laudato Si*, Pope Francis writes, “This sister now cries out to us because of the harm we have inflicted on her by our irresponsible use and abuse of the goods with which God has endowed her. We have come to see ourselves as her lords and masters, entitled to plunder her at will. The violence present in our hearts, wounded by sin, is also reflected in the symptoms of sickness evident in the soil, in the water, in the air and in all forms of life. This is why the earth herself, burdened and laid waste, is among the most abandoned and maltreated of our poor; she “groans in travail” (Rom 8:22). We have forgotten that we ourselves are dust of the earth (cf. Gen 2:7); our very bodies are made up of her elements, we breathe her air and we receive life and refreshment from her waters.” The anniversaries of Earth Day and *Laudato Si* summon us to gather, reflect, and recommit ourselves to the Care of Earth, our Common Home. How will our individual and collective choices and actions communicate our recognition of God, whose Ancient Love gave birth to the Universe and to Earth, our beloved home?



April is Autism Awareness Month: As Catholics, we are called to welcome all persons with disabilities and during the month of April, there is a particular emphasis on persons with Autism, also known as Autism Spectrum Disorder.

Inform Yourself: What is Autism? Autism is a developmental disability that can cause significant social, communication, and behavioral challenges. There is nothing about the physical appearance of a person with Autism that would set them apart from other people. Persons with Autism may learn, behave, react, and communicate in ways that are different than others.

Some persons with Autism need very little or no assistance with their daily living; others require substantial support. The intellectual abilities of persons with Autism can range from gifted to profoundly challenged. Autism affects every person differently, even among siblings who both have Autism.

Catholic parishes should work with persons with Autism, parents, and families, to determine the best way to include each person with Autism in the life of the Church.

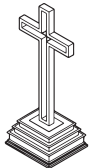
