From the Pastor's Desk...

We are the living believers in the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Last Sunday's Gospel, in which Thomas the Apostle refused to believe in the Risen Lord because he first needed to see and touch before he could come to faith, reminded us: "Blessed are those who have not seen, yet have believed."

At the time St. Luke wrote the third Gospel, most if not all of, the eyewitnesses to the Risen Jesus had already died. This was the important question of faith posed by the disciples of Luke's day: How could they believe in Him (the Risen Lord), when they have never seen? This is the same question for the living disciples today: How can we come to Resurrection faith?

The quite remarkable story about two disciples leaving Jerusalem on the road to Emmaus, illustrated for Luke's readers and for us, demonstrates how we come to Easter faith: in the faithful testimony of earlier disciples, in the Scripture, and in the Eucharist. These two disciples were disheartened and downcast, believing all they held true about Jesus of Nazareth was for naught. They conversed with the stranger and listened to him as he opened the meaning of Scripture to them concerning Jesus, the crucified prophet. They were incredulous, if not confused, about reports of the empty tomb and the women who were looking for, but did not find, Jesus.

It was only when the stranger stays with them for the evening meal, at which he took bread, blessed it, broke it and gave it to them, that suddenly they recognized Jesus in these actions which are described and repeated at every Mass. At this moment, their eyes were opened and they realized that they, too, were now witnesses to the Resurrection. Their fear and doubt were dispelled, and they hastened to tell the other disciples what they had experienced.

We are the living witnesses to the Resurrection. Our faith does not come from belief in an empty tomb, which is today a popular pilgrimage destination. An empty tomb means nothing. Just as Jesus told those who saw Him alive to go out into the world and preach the Good News, so also are we to find the Risen Lord present in the world, in the community of believers and in the Eucharist. This is the faith we must live in lives changed and renewed, aware the Risen Lord is truly with us.

Jesus Christ is risen! **Happy Easter Season!**

Please Remember Hunter Matthew Polk: I ask you in your Christian love to pray for the repose of the soul of Hunter Matthew Polk, age 24, my “good buddy,” who was found deceased after being missing for ten days on April 3rd. It is presumed he died from a lethal dose of narcotics, which remain at this time as yet undetermined.

Hunter was 6’5” tall, 250 pounds, a Division I Athletic and Academic Scholarship recipient to Duquesne University and Walsh College. He was a friendly, personable young man whose last 12 months of life were beset by tremendous emotional challenges. He was a faithful Catholic Christian, a son, brother, uncle, and grandson. He had completed an intense program of rehabilitation and recovery since February 15th of this year. Recovery, however, can take a lifetime.

Certainly, many people feel that an addict of any kind “brings this upon himself.” That would be an incomplete, if not inaccurate judgement. Hunter was a good young man, beset by emotional and physical pain. He was also an intelligent, extremely kind, and compassionate individual. He had a vision of himself as a “forgivable person,” worthy of God’s love and human forgiveness. I assured him he was all that and more. He was my good friend, despite the disparity of age. He will be sorely missed. Please pray for his family. Please pray to God for the place of rest and peace he so richly deserves.

Holy Communion “Under Both Species”: Bishop Earl Fernandes has granted permission on a trial basis (**ad experimentum** in Latin) to resume receiving Holy Communion under

the sacramental signs of bread and wine. The liturgical practice of receiving Holy Communion (the Precious Blood) from a common cup was discontinued at the very beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic in March of 2020.

Here at Holy Spirit and St. Philip the Apostle Parishes, we shall resume the protocols used prior to the onset of COVID-19. The Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will offer the chalice to the communicant and say “The Blood of Christ”; the communicant responds, “Amen” and receives the cup with two hands into his/her own hands; consumes a modest portion (sip) from the cup and hands the cup back to the minister. Please perform this sacramental action slowly, conscientiously, and reverently.

Receiving Holy Communion from the cup remains **OPTIONAL**, should anyone have health concerns or still be wary of contracting any illness (or virus). The full physical and spiritual presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist is contained in the consecrated host, without reception from the cup being seen as something “additional” or “extra.” No additional grace is received by reception under both sacramental signs.

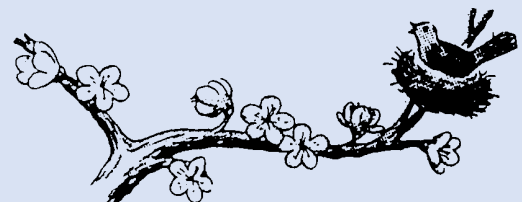
BASKETBALL

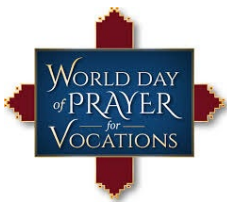

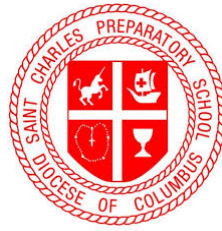

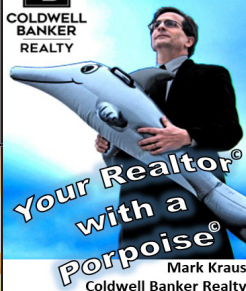
