





Please Remember Hunter Matthew Polk: I ask you in your Christian love to pray for the repose of the soul of Hunter Matthew Polk, age 24, my

"good buddy," who was found deceased after being missing for ten days on April 3rd. It is presumed he died from a lethal dose of narcotics, which remain at this time as yet undetermined.

Hunter was 6'5" tall, 250 pounds, a Division I Athletic and Academic Scholarship recipient to Duquesne University and Walsh College. He was a friendly, personable young man whose last 12 months of life were beset by tremendous emotional challenges. He was a faithful Catholic Christian, a son, brother, uncle, and grandson. He had completed an intense program of rehabilitation and recovery since February 15th of this year. Recovery, however, can take a lifetime.

Certainly, many people feel that an addict of any kind "brings this upon himself." That would be an incomplete, if not inaccurate judgement. Hunter was a good young man, beset by emotional and physical pain. He was also an intelligent, extremely kind, and compassionate individual. He had a vision of himself as a "forgivable person," worthy of God's love and human forgiveness. I assured him he was all that and more. He was my good friend, despite the disparity of age. He will be sorely missed. Please pray for his family. Please pray to God for the place of rest and peace he so richly deserves.

Holy Communion "Under Both Species": Bishop Earl Fernandes has granted permission on a trial basis (ad experimentum in Latin) to resume receiving Holy Communion under

the sacramental signs of bread and wine. The liturgical practice of receiving Holy Communion (the Precious Blood) from a common cup was discontinued at the very beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic in March of 2020.

Here at Holy Spirit and St. Philip the Apostle Parishes, we shall resume the protocols used prior to the onset of COVID-19. The Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will offer the chalice to the communicant and say "The Blood of Christ"; the communicant responds, "Amen" and receives the cup with two hands into his/her own hands; consumes a modest portion (sip) from the cup and hands the cup back to the minister. Please perform this sacramental action slowly, conscientiously, and reverently.

Receiving Holy Communion from the cup remains OPTIONAL, should anyone have health concerns or still be wary of contracting any illness (or virus). The full physical and spiritual presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist is contained in the consecrated host, without reception from the cup being seen as something "additional" or "extra." No additional grace is received by reception under both sacramental signs.
